## PER CURIAM:

Keith Antonio Barnett appeals the district court's order granting Defendants' motion for summary judgment in Barnett's action under *Bivens v. Six Unknown Fed.*Narcotics Agents, 403 U.S. 388 (1971). On appeal, we confine our review to the issues raised in the informal brief. See 4th Cir. R. 34(b). Because Barnett's informal brief does not challenge several dispositive bases for the district court's disposition, he has forfeited appellate review of those findings. See Jackson v. Lightsey, 775 F.3d 170, 177 (4th Cir. 2014) ("The informal brief is an important document; under Fourth Circuit rules, our review is limited to issues preserved in that brief.").\* Accordingly, we affirm the district court's judgment. We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before this court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
