PER CURIAM:

Lamar Alexander Sinclair appeals the district court's order denying his motion for compassionate release under 18 U.S.C. § 3582(c)(1)(A)(i), as amended by the First Step Act of 2018, Pub. L. No. 115-391, § 603(b)(1), 132 Stat. 5194, 5239. We have reviewed the record and conclude that the district court did not abuse its discretion in denying Sinclair's motion. *See United States v. Kibble*, 992 F.3d 326, 329 (4th Cir. 2021) (stating standard of review), *cert. denied*, No. 21-5624, 2021 WL 4733616 (U.S. Oct. 12, 2021). Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. *United States v. Sinclair*, No. 2:16-cr-00114-RBS-RJK-1 (E.D. Va. Mar. 11, 2021). We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before this court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
