The Federal Public Defender appointed to represent Francisco Camacho-Barajas has moved for leave to withdraw and has filed a brief in accordance with *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967). Camacho-Barajas has filed a response. The record is insufficiently developed to allow consideration at this time of Camacho-Barajas's claims of ineffective assistance of counsel.
