Bates failed to identify any jurisdictional basis for his pleading, and he failed to make any coherent argument or to state any cognizable claim. Because his appeal fails to identify any legal basis for relief,

it is frivolous, *see Howard v. King*, 707 F.2d 215, 220 (5th Cir. 1983), and is DISMISSED. *See* 5TH CIR. R. 42.2. All outstanding motions are DENIED.
