Appealing the judgment in a criminal case, Allan Mejia-Portillo presents arguments that he concedes are foreclosed by *United States v. Cepeda-Rios*, 530 F.3d 333, 335-36 (5th Cir. 2008), which held that even after *Lopez v. Gonzales*, 549 U.S. 47 (2006), a second state conviction for simple possession of a controlled substance qualifies as an aggravated felony that supports the imposition of an eight-level enhancement under U.S.S.G. § 2L1.2(b)(1)(C). The appellant's unopposed motion for summary disposition is GRANTED, and the judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED.
