Plaintiff Brandon Scott Lavergne is an inmate serving two life sentences in Louisiana state prison. Proceeding pro se and *in forma pauperis*, he filed suit against Advancial Federal Credit Union (“Advancial”) for freezing his deposit account, selling his truck, and using the proceeds from that sale and other funds in his account to pay off the note on the truck. Adopting the magistrate judge’s recommendation, the district court dismissed the case *sua*
