Appealing the judgment in a criminal case, Julian Solorzano-Gonzalez raises an argument that he concedes is foreclosed by *United States v. Rodriguez*, 711 F.3d 541, 562-63 & n.28 (5th Cir. 2013) (en banc), in which we held that the generic, contemporary definition of “sexual abuse of a minor” does not require that the age of consent be below 17 years old and does not include the asserted age-differential requirement. He also raises an argument that he

concedes is foreclosed by *United States v. Elizondo-Hernandez*, 755 F.3d 779, 781-82 (5th Cir. 2014), *cert. denied*, 135 S. Ct. 1011 (2015), which held that the Texas offense of indecency with a child by contact satisfied the generic definition of “sexual abuse of minor.” The motion for summary disposition is GRANTED, and the judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED.
