PER CURIAM:\*

Appealing the judgment in a criminal case, Juan Castro-Castro raises an argument that is foreclosed by *United States v. Gonzalez-Longoria*, 831 F.3d 670, 672 (5th Cir. 2016) (en banc), *petition for cert. filed* (Sept. 29, 2016) (No. 16-6259). In *Gonzalez-Longoria*, we held that 18 U.S.C. § 16(b), which defines a crime of violence when incorporated by reference into U.S.S.G. § 2L1.2(b)(1)(C), is not unconstitutionally vague on its face in light of *Johnson*

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*v. United States*, 135 S. Ct. 2551 (2015). Accordingly, the motion for summary affirmance is GRANTED, the alternative motion for an extension of time in which to file a brief is DENIED, and the judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED.
