# Big plays lead to a big victory for Lightning

APPLETON — Lucas Duppler grinned and then went with the politically correct answer when asked if he has ever gotten in the ears of his coaches to open up the playbook a bit.

"No, not really, because we know we don't have much of an input anyway," the Appleton North senior wide receiver/defensive back said. "We usually just keep quiet, and they'll put us in the right positions."

Did they ever.

Long known for its power rushing attack, the Lightning provided potential future opponents with an additional worry on its way to an impressive 35-7 victory over Green Bay Preble on Tuesday in a WIAA Division 1, Level 1 showdown at Appleton North.

That would be big plays out of the passing game, including a pair that proved to be backbreakers in helping North (8-2) advance to a Level 2 face-off with Bay Port (8-2) on Saturday.

The first was a 40-yard bomb on third-and-forever from senior quarterback Brad Odeman to Duppler that pushed the ball from midfield to the Preble nine and led to a second-quarter touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

## WIAA Division 1, Level 1: Appleton North 35, Green Bay Preble 7

### D-fense

One of the concerns for Appleton North was slowing a Preble running attack that had amassed 2,213 yards during the Fox River Classic Conference season.

Mission accomplished since the Lightning (8-2) limited the Hornets (7-3) to a mere 74 rushing yards on 32 attempts — a 2.3 yards per carry average.

"We made some adjustments earlier in the week to make sure we adjusted to motions or their unbalanced formations," North senior nose tackle Garrett Bennett said. "And we just tried to key on the lineman and make sure we knew where they were

going and not let the quarterback or anybody make a big play and bounce it off."

The only big plays of the night for Preble came via the legs of senior quarterback Steve Vanden Avond, who was effective with his ball fakes in running a handful of keepers during a drive that resulted in his three-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

Preble senior running back Matt Pieschek, who finished fourth in the FRCC in rushing with 907 yards, was held to 17 yards on nine carries.

"We had to come a little bit lower, a little bit harder — we had to use our techniques a little bit better," Hornets coach Patrick

Prochnow said. "And somehow, we fell a little bit short."

### Big drive

North needed 11 plays to march 74 yards on its opening drive of the second half, which ended with a seven-yard touchdown run by junior tailback Steve Lichtfuss.

That turned a 14-point advantage into a 21-point cushion and all but sealed the outcome as nearly five minutes was shaved off the clock.

Lichtfuss carried the ball 10 times for 65 yards on the drive, with many of the plays pitches to the left side. The Fox Valley Association's all-time single-season rusher finished with 198 yards on

31 carries. He has 1,815 yards on the year.

"We wanted to come out in the second half and establish the line of scrimmage on both the offensive and defensive side of the ball," North coach Paul Engen said. "And I thought we did that."

### Scouting report

Up next for the Lightning is a WIAA Division 1 Level 2 date with a familiar foe — Bay Port, which whipped top seed Chippewa Falls 34-14 on Tuesday and will meet North on Saturday.

The Lightning beat Bay Port 29-11 in a Level 1 opener last season after falling to the Pirates 24-14 in a Level 1 game in 2006.

passer, completed seven of his 12 attempts for 118 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

"We designed it so I'd just go out of bounds, but the ball was thrown just so I could keep going up field," said Duppler, who caught five balls for 104 yards and two touchdowns. "Luckily, (wide receiver) Nate Hans threw a block for me, and I was able to get into the end zone. That really swung the momentum right back to us and gave us some confidence going into the half."

Said Preble head coach Patrick Prochnow: "That was a big play for them. Yes, I guess it's a matter of a situation where we shouldn't have allowed it. But that's the way this thing goes."

While the Lightning was able to do things through the air, particularly off the play-action, it also did what it often does best: run the ball.

North rushed for 270 yards on 50 attempts — a 5.4 yards per average carry — with tailback Steve Licht-

fuss, the Fox Valley Association's single-season rushing leader, accounting for 198.

The junior scored twice, on runs of 28 and seven yards.

"A lot of people will say this is what we do, you've got to have a staple of what we're about," Lightning coach Paul Engen said. "We want to be able to run the ball, but we work very hard with the other things. And the thing I'm very happy with up to this point, the kids have gotten better."

"Last year, I don't think Lucas played at all on offense, and he's practiced and gotten better. And Brad's gotten better because he takes it very seriously. There's some things he needed to work on earlier in the year, and he's gotten better at them. He can throw the ball. He gives us something else. You just can't load it in the box in there."

### Defense makes stops

Hilbert's defense gave up some big plays in the first half, but true to the Wolves' bend-but-don't-break philosophy, they stopped Marion twice at the Hilbert 20-yard line.

"Our defense played well in the first half, (but) we just broke down in the secondary at times," Hilbert coach Mike Breckheimer said. "We were in good position, (but) we didn't make plays."

"We had a couple drives in the first half where we couldn't get over the hump," Marion coach Mark Frey said. "The kids moved the ball down there and we stalled out. Against a team like that, we have to execute. If

we could have put one in before the half, it could have been a huge momentum builder."

After Hilbert scored early in the third quarter to take a 19-0 lead, the Mustangs threatened again, but Ben Krueger intercepted a pass at the Hilbert 10-yard line.

### Difference in experience

Marion was in the playoffs for the first time since 1991, while Hilbert made the postseason for the 14th time in 18 years.

"We started off a little slow," Frey said. "We tried to prepare the kids for playoff football and that's hard to do at practice. They (the Wolves) know what playoff

football is all about. They came out from the opening kickoff and got a couple of scores on us."

HILBERT — Hilbert's recipe for success was pretty simple: A lot of Nick Sweere, a mixture of Luke Patterman and Ben Gruett and don't forget the Hoggies.

That added up to 446 yards rushing, which was a big part of the Wolves' 33-7 win over Marion in a WIAA Division 7, Level 1 playoff game Tuesday night.

Sweere accounted for a career-best 221 yards and two touchdowns on 22 rushes. Patterman, Hilbert's quarterback, ran nine times for 104 yards and three touchdowns, while Gruett had 16 carries for 90 yards.

Hilbert's linemen, affectionately known as the Hoggies, led the way as the Wolves rushed for at least 10 yards on 15 plays against the Mustangs.

"It's all thanks to the linemen," Sweere said. "They blocked great for me today."

With Hilbert (10-0) leading 12-0 at halftime, Sweere gave the Wolves instant momentum in the third quarter by busting a 59-yard run off right tackle. Patterman scored on a six-yard run on the next play to push Hilbert's lead to 19-0.

After Patterman scored on a 36-yard run later in the quarter, Sweere added a 15-yard touchdown early in the fourth.

"He's quick," Patterman said of Sweere, a 5-foot-11, 150-pound senior. "He's going to make a move, and he's hard to tackle. He's not very big, but he's hard to bring down."

Early on, it appeared that the Wolves might be on the way to a rout. They scored

on their first two possessions and held Marion without a first down.

But Hilbert had two drives stall at the Mustangs' 16-yard line, courtesy of an interception and a fumble.

"We should have been up by more, but we came out in the second half and we almost forgot about what we did (in the first half)," Patterman said. "We knew we had to come out firing."

That's what happened, as

the Wolves put the game away with touchdowns on three of their first four drives in the second half.

"We made some adjustments at halftime," Hilbert coach Mike Breckheimer said. "Marion was switching their defensive linemen a little bit, and in the first half our kids weren't blocking their linebackers. In the second half, we got blocks on the linebackers, and that made a big difference."

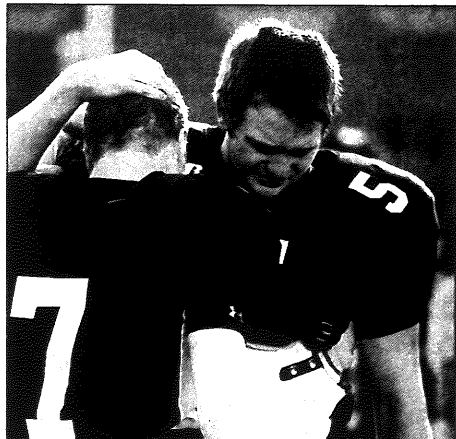
