PER CURIAM.

Guatemalan citizen Toledo Domingo-Felipe petitions for review of an order of the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA), which summarily affirmed an Immigration Judge's (IJ's) denial of asylum and withholding of removal.¹

¹The IJ's decision, therefore, constitutes the final agency determination for purposes of judicial review. <u>See Kimumwe v. Gonzales</u>, 431 F.3d 319, 322 (8th Cir. 2005).

After careful review of the record, we conclude the IJ's decision, that Domingo-Felipe failed to establish either past persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution on account of a protected ground, is supported by substantial evidence in the record as a whole. <u>See Eta-Ndu v. Gonzales</u>, 411 F.3d 977, 982-83 (8th Cir. 2005) (standard of review). Because Domingo-Felipe failed to meet the burden of proof on his asylum claim, his application for withholding of removal necessarily fails as well. <u>See Turay v. Ashcroft</u>, 405 F.3d 663, 667 (8th Cir. 2005) (withholding-of-removal standard is more rigorous than asylum standard).

Accordingly, we deny the petition.
