PER CURIAM.

Following a hearing, the district court¹ ordered Howard Lane committed under 18 U.S.C. § 4245 to the custody of the Attorney General, for hospital care and treatment in a suitable facility until treatment is no longer needed or his sentence expires, whichever occurs first. Lane appeals. Having carefully reviewed the record, we are satisfied that the district court's findings as to Lane's condition and need for

mental-health treatment are not clearly erroneous. See 18 U.S.C. § 4245(d) (determination of mental illness and treatment need, and burden of proof); United States v. Bean, 373 F.3d 877, 879 (8th Cir. 2004) (standard of review). Accordingly, we affirm, and we grant counsel's motion to withdraw.
