## PER CURIAM.

After Matthew Cunningham pleaded guilty to distributing child pornography, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(2), the district court¹ sentenced him to 120 months in prison and 8 years of supervised release. Counsel has moved to withdraw and has filed a brief under <u>Anders v. California</u>, 386 U.S. 738 (1967), arguing that the sentence is unreasonable.

The sentence, which represents a substantial downward variance from the advisory Guidelines range of 188-235 months, is not unreasonable, see <u>United States v. Lazarski</u>, 560 F.3d 731, 733 (8th Cir. 2009); and having reviewed the record under <u>Penson v. Ohio</u>, 488 U.S. 75 (1988), we have found no nonfrivolous issues.

Accordingly, we affirm, and we grant counsel's motion to withdraw.
