We further conclude that the district court did not abuse its discretion in declining to appoint Ajaj counsel. See Davis v. Scott, 94 F.3d 444, 447 (8th Cir. 1996). Accordingly, we affirm the judgment and deny as moot Ajaj's pending motions.
