PER CURIAM.

Keith Brown appeals the district court's¹ order affirming the denial of supplemental security income and disability insurance benefits. Following de novo review, see Myers v. Colvin, 721 F.3d 521, 524 (8th Cir. 2013), we conclude that the administrative law judge's (ALJ's) credibility analysis was proper, that the residual functional capacity determination was supported by the record, and that the vocational expert's testimony that Brown could perform a significant number of jobs existing in the national economy was based on a properly phrased hypothetical question and constituted substantial evidence to support the ALJ's assessment, see Buckner v. Astrue, 646 F.3d 549, 560-61 (8th Cir. 2011).
