PER CURIAM.

This is an appeal from an adverse adjudication of civil contempt made by the district court¹ in Fair Labor Standards Act proceedings first initiated more than a decade ago by the Secretary of the United States Department of Labor against El Pato, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Corporation, Inc.; JYR's El Maguey Corporation, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Mexican Restaurant; El Sapo, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Mexican Restaurant; El Sapo, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Mexican Restaurant; El Sapo, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Mexican Restaurant; Bapo, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Mexican Restaurant; El Sapo, Inc., doing business as El Maguey Restaurant; Manuel Jaime; Humberto Jaime; and Justo Adan. After careful review of the record and the parties' arguments on appeal, we conclude that the district court did not abuse its discretion. <u>See F.T.C. v. Neiswonger</u>, 580 F.3d 769, 773 (8th Cir. 2009) (standard of review). Accordingly, we affirm. <u>See</u> 8th Cir. R. 47B.
