PER CURIAM.

In 2008 Ryan Siders pled guilty to being a felon in possession of a firearm and was sentenced to 57 months imprisonment and a three year term of supervised

release. In 2015 the district court¹ found Siders in violation of his supervised release for the third time after he failed to comply with substance abuse testing, used a controlled substance, consumed alcohol, and operated a motor vehicle while intoxicated. The court revoked his supervised release. The advisory guidelines sentencing range was 8 to 14 months. The court imposed a sentence of 12 months imprisonment and one year of supervised release.

Siders argues that the court imposed a substantively unreasonable sentence under 18 U.S.C. § 3553(a). We conclude that the district court did not abuse its discretion in the sentence it imposed. <u>See United States v. Petreikis</u>, 551 F.3d 822, 824 (8th Cir. 2009) (standard of review). Accordingly, we affirm. <u>See</u> 8th Cir. R. 47B.
