OPINION AND ORDER

The plaintiff, a federal prisoner, filed this case under the Administrative Procedures Act, 5 U.S.C. §§ 551-559, and <u>Bivens v. Six Unknown Federal Narcotics</u> <u>Agents</u>, 403 U.S. 388 (1971), challenging the adequacy of the Montgomery Federal Prison Camp's law library, and specifically the decision of defendant Melissa Hemingway to discard the American Jurisprudence treatise series and to take away certain electronic typewriters with memory and replace them with simple manual ones. This case is before the court on the recommendation of the United States Magistrate Judge that plaintiff's "motion for a writ of mandamus" be denied. There are no objections to the recommendation.
