#### MEMORANDUM OPINION

By agreement of the attorneys of record for the respective parties hereto, this action was submitted for judgment of the court on plaintiff's prayer for finel injunctive relief on the complaint, the snaver of defendants, and the oral testimony in open court of Dr. Kermit Johnson, Superintendent of Jefferson County Eshcols, together with the exhibits thereto.

Brought as a class action by a Megro citizen presently attending the public schools of Jefferson County, Alabama, and in behalf of other Megro pitizens almilarly situated, plaintiff, in essence, prays for a complete desogregation of the Jefferson County public achoel system with all of its appurtuances to be accomplished by an affirmative injunction requiring, making other things, defendants to subsit for approval of the court a plan for the assignment of pupils, teachers, principals, and other school personnel on a non-racial basis.

Defendant, Jefferson County Deard of Education, comprised of five sembers elected by popular vote and who are defendants herein, is responsible for the operation of all public schools within Jefferson County except those within the

Hountain Brook, Tarrant and Pairfield. There are 114 schools in the system, attended by approximately 53,000 pupils, 45,000 of whom are white and 18,000 Negro. Approximately 25 per cent of them reside in rural areas and 75 per cent in orban or suburban areas. Twenty-two hundred and sixty-eight teachers are employed by the Goard, of whom 500 are Megroes.

While there is no official or resord designation of any of such schools as white or Negro, the evidence is undisputed that no Vegro pupil has ever attended a school attended by white pupils in the county system. Consisting of grades one through twelve, the system is operated on the six-three-three plan, the first els grades comprising the elementary school, the next three grades comprising the junior high school, and the last three grades comprising the senior high school. There are areas within the county where white and Vegro pupils are mixed as to residences and other areas where Negro pupils reside closer to schools presently attended only by white pupils than to schools attended only by Negroes.

The Board provides transportation in its 253 buses for all children who live more than two miles from the school which they are attending. Megro pupils ride only in buses occupied exclusively by Megroes and there are instances where the bus routes traveled by buses occupied by white pupils, on the one hand, and Megro pupils, on the other, overlap.

We Tegro teacher has ever been assigned to a school attended by white pupils, nor has any white teacher ever been assigned to a school attended only by Megro pupils. Negro administrative personnel function only with reference to schools attended by Megroes, while white administrative personnel are primarily concerned with the affairs pertaining to schools attended by white pupils.

While the evidence is undisputed that no application has ever been filed seeking the transfer of a Megro pupil to any school within the system attended by white pupils, as sutherized by the Alabama School Placement Law, the Sourt of Angeals for the Fifth Circuit, in its opinion ordering the issuance of an interlocutory injunction in Arestrons, et al v. Bd. of Ed., Sirs., Als., et al, 323 v.20 333 (5th Cir. 1963), held: "The burden of initiating desegregation does not rest on Megro children or parents or on whites, but on the School Board." Thereafter, the court explicitly stated: "Nothing contained in this opinion or in the order directed to be issued by the district court is intended to seen that voluntary segregation is unlawful; or that the same is not legally permissible."

On the record in this case the only failure to discharge its "burden of initiating desegregation" which may be escribed to the Board has been inaction on the part of Superintendent and Board in giving notice to students, parents, teachers and other appropriate school personnel exhaulated to inform them of the rights of degro parents and pupils to apply for transfer to schools attended by white pupils.

For obvious resears it would be premature for the court to rule at this time in reference to the assignment of teachers, principals, supervisors, or other professional school personnel. The court expressly disalsies the expression of any opinion as to whether a Begro publi, an opposed to other persons who would be immediately affected, has standing to seek such relief. Moreover, such destions can be more appropriately considered by the Board and by the court if necessary at some future date.

A separate order, which the court believes will be selfexplanatory, granting a part of the relief for which claimtiff prays will be filed and entered herein. As a cavest, the plan to be submitted pursuant to such order, insofar as tising is descented, should parallel that submitted by the Hoard of Education of the City of Sirmingham required by the opinion and mandate of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in Armstrong, et al. y. Bd. of Ed., Birm., Als., et al. 333 F.26 47 (5th Cir. 1964).
