4. Defendants X and Y, are those persons, firms or corporations, the names of which are unknown to Plaintiff, operating web pages "www.scam.com" and "www.pissedconsumer.com" chosen by Defendant Google, Inc. to be featured with prominent placement in all its search engine results whenever Plaintiff American Income Life Insurance Company's name is searched through computer terminals in Alabama. The true identity of these fictitious parties is available and/or known to Defendant Google, Inc., but concealed by it, and therefore unknown to Plaintiff, but when the true names of these parties true names are discovered during this litigation, process will be served upon them and all pleadings and proceedings in this action will by amendment be substituted, pursuant to Rule 9(f), Alabama Rules of Civil Procedure.

JURISDICTION

5. This action is brought under the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act, which confers jurisdiction upon this Court to address Plaintiff's claim that all Defendants, acting in concert, have engaged in deceptive acts or practices in the conduct of trade or commerce in Alabama within the scope of *Code of Ala.*, § 8-9-5(8) and are engaging in other unconscionable, false, misleading or deceptive acts or practices, all as are more particularly described and prohibited by the Act.

6. Plaintiff American Income Life Insurance Company caused the "15-Day Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act Letter dated July 2, 2011, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to be delivered to Defendant Google, Inc., made clear its general counsel the company's complicity in a misrepresenting plan, scheme, or system described by *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-5(20), but Defendant Google, Inc. chose to ignore this warning and, in lieu of taking action to prevent

continuing violation of the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act, merely responded with perfunctory computer-generated form letters, which are also included at Exhibit "A."

7. Jurisdiction is further exclusively conferred upon this Court by the fact that Plaintiff brings this action solely pursuant to the statutory law of the State of Alabama, no claim here being made under the Constitution or laws of the United States of America, by the fact that Plaintiff further affirmatively waives and foregoes any claim for damages exceeding Seventy-Five Thousand (\$75,000.00) Dollars, exclusive of interest and costs.

VENUE

8. This action may, pursuant to *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-10(c), be brought in the Circuit Court for the county in which the defendant resides, has its principal place of business, is doing business, or has committed the unlawful act or practice alleged. Defendant Google, Inc. has not qualified to do business in Alabama, despite its doing so, and is a foreign corporation permitted to be sued in any county in Alabama, one of which is Jefferson.

ALLEGATIONS OF FACT

9. Defendant Google, Inc. was created in 1998 by Stanford University graduate students Larry Page and Sergey Brin, after these two individuals built a search engine called "BackRub" that used "links" to determine the importance of individual web pages.

10. Since 1998, Google, Inc. has, in its own parlance, "grown by leaps and bounds" by offering "search" in a "single language," and offering dozens of products and services, including various forms of advertising and web applications that it sells "for all kinds of tasks, and by devoting more engineering time to search than to any other product."

11. Defendant Google, Inc. claims to rely on millions of individuals posting links on

web pages to determine which offer “content of value,” while assessing the importance of every web page, using more than 200 signals and a variety of proprietary techniques, and touts its patented “Page Rank” algorithm (also called a “Black Box algorithm”) to analyze which sites are the “best sources of information across the web” for its seller-assisted marketing plan

12. Defendant Google, Inc.’s patented “Page Rank” algorithm has afforded prominent placement in its search engine broadcasting to the Fictitious Defendants, as part of the seller-assisted marketing plan of Defendants, for several years.

13. The Fictitious Defendants’s banners and content, broadcast via Defendant Google, Inc.’s search engine throughout Alabama, via hundreds of thousands of computer terminals, violates the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act by falsely asserting that “American Income Life is a Scam,” and Defendant Google, Inc. has knowingly, since delivery of the 15-Day Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act Letter to Defendant Google, Inc., dated July 2, 2011, attached hereto as Exhibit “A,” intentionally disparaged the goods, services, or business of Plaintiff by false and/or misleading representations of fact prohibited by *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-5(8) and (20).

14. Plaintiff American Income Life Insurance Company is not a scam, and is, in fact, a reputable and upstanding business corporation engaged in the lawful and above-board business of selling insurance policies; it is not engaged in any of the disparaging and/or misleading representations of fact alleged by Defendant Google, Inc. and the Fictitious Defendants via their seller-assisted, search engine marketing plan.

15. *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-10(a) affords Plaintiffs a private right of action, as a “person” [defined by *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-3(5) to include corporations] and consumer caused monetary

damage by one or more of the acts or practices declared unlawful under the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act, including treble damages, in the Court's discretion, after consideration by the Court of their amount of actual damage, the frequency of the unlawful acts or practices, the number of persons adversely affected thereby, and the extent to which such unlawful acts or practices were committed intentionally.

16. After receipt of the 15-Day Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act Letter dated July 2, 2011, attached hereto as Exhibit "A," Defendant Google, Inc. has cavalierly and intentionally continued, unabated, to engage in the acts of complained of herein, which are unlawful under the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act.

1. While Plaintiffs damages sustained as a result of the violations of the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act exceed millions of dollars, eacht has affirmatively limited recovery for same to less than Seventy Five Thousand (\$75,000.00), exclusive of interest and costs.

15. Upon commencement of this action, Plaintiff has caused the Clerk of the Court, in compliance with *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-10(d), to mail a copy of this "complaint or other initial pleading" to the Office of the Attorney General and to the local District Attorney.

Wherefore, Plaintiffs demands judgment and the following relief against Defendants as follows:

A. Damages in a sum of less than Seventy Five Thousand (\$75,000.00) Dollars, exclusive of interest and costs.

B. After commencement by the Attorney General or local District Attorney of an action in the name of the State of Alabama against Defendants, an order restraining by way of

permanent injunction, their unlawful acts and practices, as provided by *Code of Ala.*, § 8-19-8(a).

C. An order enjoining Defendants from engaging in business in this state, for continuous and willful violations of the provisions of the Alabama Deceptive Trade Practices Act, until such willful violations cease, as provided by *Code of Ala.*, § 8(c).

Dear Mr. Drummond:

We represent American Income Life Insurance Company, a wholly owned subsidiary of Torchmark Corporation, a Fortune 500 company with a problem only you can simply resolve. American Income has fallen prey to number of "scam/scam" schemes devised by unscrupulous persons who misuse Google's well known "black box" algorithm for undue search engine placement in connection with designs to harass and disparage reputable businesses. These "scam/scam" schemes work this way: a person creates a site and targets a reputable company with a good reputation and levels anonymous, untrue and commercially unwarranted postings against it, pretending to serve a "whistleblower" public service. They allege a "scam" that is not a "scam" (hence the term "scam/scam"). These individuals then manipulate your "black box" algorithm to assure high placement for search engine research purposes when a job applicant at the targeted company seeks information about it.

Currently, if you employ your search engine to research "American Income Life Insurance Company," you will find that your "Black Box" algorithm affords page one placement to two we suspect are "scam/scam" artists: "Scam.com" and "PissedConsumer.com." These have Google banners that read: "American Income Life is a Scam" (www.scam.com) and "American Income Life @ Pissed Consumer" (www.pissedconsumer.com). After conducting such a routine examination, you will understand that my clients are reasonable in having me complain to you, not regarding the First Amendment right of scam/scams like these to exist, but regarding the prominent "page one" placement that Google has afforded them by allowing manipulation of its "black box" algorithm for their corrupt purposes. Indeed, our research indicated that it is this prominent "page one" placement at Google that causes the losses my client is experiencing.

We have analyzed my client's losses sustained from job applicants declining to appear for scheduled interviews due to this prominent placement, and these losses already amount to

millions of dollars. We are continuing to interview applicants that have been scheduled to appear for interviews, but failed to do so, and expect the magnitude of these losses – and their direct causal link to Google’s “page one” placement – to climb.


I have no doubt that Google’s complicity in these schemes has been unwitting (at least to the point of receipt of this letter), and harbor no doubt that your position with Google affords you power to right this wrong. Please allow me to suggest this reasonable solution: after convincing yourself of the true nature of these postings, change their listing priority to below page two (or below 25th individual ranking) for your search engine’s results when “American Income Life Insurance Company” is employed as a search term. In connection with this reasonable request, I am also willing, but only if necessary, to come to your office in Mountain View and demonstrate the magnitude and true nature of this problem (though I’m confident you will reach the same conclusion I have by way of an independent investigation). If I don’t hear from you within a reasonable time, I will have no choice but to file a suit to address this matter. Before doing so, as counsel for one publicly traded company to another, I am proposing this practical solution.

I am certain that neither of us views litigation as a wise first-course solution for any problem. Like Google, the companies I represent are not hesitant to invoke the jurisdiction of federal courts when there is no other practical recourse. Indeed, Torchmark companies have retained me to represent them in many diverse legal actions across the country. But we take greater pride in reasonable settlements we’ve achieved than in the cases we’ve won together. We do this because far too many courtroom victories are – from a shareholder perspective – Phyrrie.

Please “Google-search” American Income Life Insurance Company and begin to understand the nature of this problem. You are in a unique position to learn the true nature of these corporate shakedown schemes through a quick internal investigation. I encourage you to undertake one. For me, similar results required the assistance of a private investigator and, if litigation proves necessary, will require more formal discovery. My client is not naturally inclined to file lawsuits, but the severity of the problem and the magnitude of its losses has convinced it to do so if this settlement proposal is rejected. Our hope is that sanity and common sense will prevail. If not, it has instructed me to spare no expense in stopping this injury and recovering its losses.

15-DAY ALABAMA DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES ACT LETTER
Code of Ala., §8-19-10(e)

Dear Mr. Drummond:

Please refer to this firm's attached previous correspondence to you, and a reply from "The Google Team," also attached. This notice is to advise that the practices engaged in by Google Inc. and the sites that are currently acting in complicity with it at www.scam.com and www.pissedconsumer.com are unlawfully disparaging the goods, services or business of another by false or misleading representation of fact within the scope of *Code of Ala., §8-19-5(8)* and that Google Inc. and the owners of these sites are engaging in other unconscionable, false, misleading or deceptive acts or practices in the conduct of trade or commerce, all with respect to our client, American Income Life Insurance Company. This 15-day notice is sent to advise you, Google Inc. and "The Google Team" that under Alabama law, 15 days after communication of this notice we are permitted to, and will, file a private right of action in Jefferson County, Alabama against Google Inc. and the aforementioned sites, including such persons, firms and corporations as are discovered to be operating them, to recover American Income Life Insurance Company's actual damages, three times its actual damages (in the court's discretion), costs of the action, reasonable attorneys fees and a request for injunctive relief, specifically an order that Google Inc. remove, in all transmissions by its search engines to computer terminals located within the State of Alabama, the content described by "The Google Team" in the attached correspondence as "the offending material."

Under Alabama law, Google Inc. is permitted, within 15 days of delivery of this communication, to make a written tender of settlement and, if such tender is rejected by our client, Google Inc. may file its written tender and an affidavit concerning this rejection in



the suit we file. If the court finds that any relief tendered is sufficient to compensate the petitioner for its actual damages, the court will not award additional damages or attorney's fees or costs to the petitioner. If Google Inc. does not maintain a place of business or does not keep assets within the State of Alabama, it may otherwise employ the tender provisions of *Code of Ala.*, §8-19-10(e), a copy of which is attached, by making a written tender offer of relief and by paying the rejected tender into court as soon as practicable after receiving notice of the action commenced under this section.

By law, upon commencement of this action, the Clerk shall mail a copy of the complaint or other initial pleading to the Office of the Attorney General and to the local District Attorney and, upon entry of any injunction, judgment, or decree in the action, mail a copy of such injunction, judgment or decree to the Office of the Attorney General and to the local District Attorney.
