MEMORANDUM OPINION

This is an action on a petition for writ of habeas corpus brought pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2241 by Mohammed Abdikarim Issack ("Petitioner"). Petitioner challenges the legality of his continued detention by federal immigration authorities pending his removal under the Immigration and Nationality Act. (*See* Doc. 1). Respondents have now filed a motion to dismiss the action as moot, on the ground that Petitioner has been removed from the United States. (Doc. 8).

Respondents' motion is supported by a declaration by a Supervisory

Detention and Deportation Officer who states that Petitioner was removed from

the United States on March 9, 2017. (Doc. 8-1). As a result, Petitioner's habeas corpus claim for release under an order of supervision or for repatriation is moot because the court can no longer provide meaningful relief. *See Nyaga v. Ashcroft*, 323 F.3d 906, 913 (11th Cir. 2003). Respondents' motion is due to be granted and this action is due to be dismissed. A separate Final Order will be entered.
