**MEMORANDUM OPINION**

This civil action was initiated on October 23, 2017, by Timothy Burns on behalf of his minor daughter, A.B., based on a pleading Burns has styled, “A Writ of Habeas Corpus.” (Doc.<sup>1</sup> 1). On November 3, 2017, the magistrate judge to whom the case was referred entered a Report and Recommendation (“R&R”) pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b), FED. R. CIV. P. 72(b)(1), recommending that the Burns’s petition be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction, because its allegations indicate that A.B. is not “in custody” for purposes of the federal habeas corpus statutes. (Doc. 3). The court advised Burns that he might file objections to the



magistrate judge's R&R, but the time in which he was required to do so has expired with no objections having been filed. (*See* Docs. 3, 5).

Having carefully reviewed and considered *de novo* all the materials in the court file, including the magistrate judge's Report and Recommendation, the court is of the opinion that the magistrate judge's findings are due to be and are hereby **ADOPTED** and his recommendation is **ACCEPTED**. As a result, the petition for writ of habeas corpus is due to be **DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE**, for lack of jurisdiction. A separate final order will be entered.
