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Plaintiff Miller respectfully moves this Court for a preliminary injunction prohibiting Defendants from:

certifying the results of the 2010 general election for the office of U.S. 1. 3 4 Senator based on a count in which write-in votes were accepted as valid, on which the 5 candidate's name was misspelled, or was not written on the ballot as it appeared on the 6 candidate's write-in declaration of candidacy; or

2. accepting as valid any write-in votes in which a candidate's name is 8 misspelled, or is not written on the ballot as it appears on the candidate's write-in 9 declaration of candidacy, in any further counts or recounts of the ballots in the 2010 general election for the office of U.S. Senator.

Plaintiff Miller also wishes to clarify that the relief that he seeks would not apply to any federal write-in absentee ballots, cast in compliance with the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA), 42 U.S.C. § 1973ff, et seq., as that statute (unlike the Alaska law that generally applies to write-in ballots, Alaska Stat. § 15.15.360) expressly allows such ballots to be counted if they contain minor misspellings or variations on candidates' names.
