Petition to Revoke Supervised Release**SEALED**

COMES NOW PROBATION OFFICER ASSISTANT Melissa A. Sullivan presenting an official report on Miguel Angel REYES-MELCHOR who was committed to the Bureau of Prisons on December 5, 2005, by the Honorable Frederick J. Martone presiding in the District Court of Arizona. A 36 month period of supervised release was imposed, and supervision commenced upon the offender's discharge from imprisonment on March 9, 2007. In addition to the general terms and conditions adopted by the Court, the offender was ordered to comply with the following special conditions:

1. If deported, you shall not re-enter the United States without legal authorization.
2. You shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer.

Miguel Angel REYES-MELCHOR was convicted of Transportation of Illegal Aliens, 8 USC §1324(a)(1)(A)(ii), a Class C felony.

RESPECTFULLY PRESENTING PETITION FOR ACTION OF COURT FOR CAUSE AS FOLLOWS:**Allegation A. Violation of Standard Condition No. 1: You shall not commit another federal, state or local crime during the term of supervision.**

On or about June 3, 2007, REYES-MELCHOR committed the new federal offenses of re-entry after deportation, a felony and unlawful entry, a misdemeanor. This is evidenced by a complaint filed June 3, 2007, in the Southern District of California, case no. 07-10361M-001-SD. Court proceedings are pending. **Grade B Violation, §7B1.1(a)(2).**


Allegation B. Violation of Special Condition No. 1: If deported, you shall not re-enter the United States without legal authorization.

1. On or about May 17, 2007, REYES-MELCHOR entered the United States without legal authorization. This is evidenced by his May 17, 2007, arrest by Border Patrol Agents and removal from the United States to Mexico that same day. This arrest was subsequent to his March 9, 2007, deportation. **Grade C Violation, §7B1.1(a)(3).**


2. On or about June 3, 2007, REYES-MELCHOR entered the United States without legal authorization. This is evidenced by his June 3, 2007, arrest by Border Patrol Agents near Andrade, California. This arrest was subsequent to his May 17, 2007, deportation. **Grade C Violation, §7B1.1(a)(3).**

AFFIDAVIT AND PETITION PRAYING THAT THE COURT WILL ORDER A WARRANT BE ISSUED




