transported in interstate and foreign commerce, and which contained images that had been mailed shipped and transported by any means including by computer, the production of which involved the use of a minor engaged in sexually explicit conduct and which is of such conduct, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 2252(a)(4) and (b)(2).

## BASIS OF COMPLAINANT'S CHARGE AGAINST THE ACCUSED:

On or about January 19, 2007, the Honorable Jennifer C. Guerin, United States Magistrate Judge for the District of Arizona, issued a search warrant for the residence of one JERALD MARK KOENIG, DOB: 1958, located at 200 Howard Street, Apartment 19, Huachuca City, Arizona, after determining that probable cause existed that the residence contained evidence of child pornography-related offenses under Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252.

On January 24, 2007, agents from the Federal Bureau of Investigations executed the federal search warrant at 200 Howard St., Apt. 19, Huachuca City, AZ, and seized a computer located therein. While the search of the residence was being conducted, Special Agent Mark Strickland and your affiant conducted a non-custodial interview with KOENIG. At that time, KOENIG, admitted the computer was his, that he purchased it approximately one years ago, and that he is the only person who uses it.

In addition, KOENIG stated that approximately 20% of the images stored in "My Pictures" on his computer would be child pornography.

During the execution of the search warrant, an on-site computer forensics preview examination was performed on the computer belonging to KOENIG and located in his bedroom at the time of execution of the search warrant. The forensic preview revealed numerous child pornographic images. A description of two representative images is as follows:

- 1) A prepubescent female naked from the waist down, sitting on the ground, legs spread, and with her genitals exposed.
- 2) A prepubescent female, totally nude, standing, with her genitals exposed.

The first image referred to above is of a known out-of-state victim, and the image has traveled in interstate commerce. The defendant's computer had access to the internet through Earthlink, which is an internet service provider.
