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MOTION/STIPULATION TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE COMPLAINT FOR FORFEITURE AND/OR TO OBTAIN INDICTMENT ALLEGING FORFEITURE

MC-07-75-PHX-JAT

(Second Request)

The United States of America, and through its attorney, DANIEL G. KNAUSS, United States Attorney for the District of Arizona, and Lisa Roberts, Assistant United States Attorney. and John W. Will ("Claimant"), by and through his attorney, Wade F. Waldrip, Sampair & Waldrip, P.C. as authorized by 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), hereby stipulate, and request that the Court extend the 18 U.S.C. § 983 time limit in which the United States is required to file a complaint for forfeiture or obtain an indictment, from its current date of October 12, 2007, regarding property to which a claim has been filed by John W. Hill, in a nonjudicial civil forfeiture proceeding with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives ("ATF"). That property consists of one hundred nineteen (119) firearms, seized from John H. Hill, in ATF Case # 785045-06-0016. The parties stipulate to the following:

- 1. All of the written notice of intent to forfeit required by 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(1)(A) to be sent by the ATF to interested parties has been sent.
 - 2. The time has expired for any person to file a claim to the property under 18 U.S.C.

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 $\S 983(a)(2)(A)-(E)$.

3. No person other than John H. Hill has filed a claim to the property as required by law in the nonjudicial civil forfeiture proceeding.

MEMORANDUM

18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A)-(C) states:

- (A) Not later than 90 days after a claim has been filed, the Government shall file a complaint for forfeiture in the manner set forth in the Supplemental Rules for Certain Admiralty and Maritime Claims or return the property pending the filing of a complaint, except that a court in the district in which the complaint will be filed may extend the period for filing a complaint for good cause shown or upon agreement of the parties.
 - (B) If the Government does not -
- (I) file a complaint for forfeiture or return the property, in accordance with subparagraph (A); or
 - (ii) before the time for filing a complaint has expired -
- (I) obtain a criminal indictment containing an allegation that the property is subject to forfeiture; and
- (II) take the steps necessary to preserve its right to maintain custody of the property as provided in the applicable criminal forfeiture statute, the Government shall promptly release the property pursuant to regulations promulgated by the Attorney General, and may not take any further action to effect the civil forfeiture of such property in connection with the underlying offense.
- (C) In lieu of, or in addition to, filing a civil forfeiture complaint, the Government may include a forfeiture allegation in a criminal indictment. If criminal forfeiture is the only forfeiture proceeding commenced by the Government, the Government's right to continued possession of the property shall be governed by the applicable criminal forfeiture statute.

On or about April 19, 2007, the ATF seized the above stated property.

ATF initiated administrative forfeiture proceedings, and sent notice of the seizure to potential Claimant John H. Hill. On May 29, 2007, Claimant, by and through his attorney, Wade F. Waldrip, filed a claim to the property with the ATF in a non-judicial civil forfeiture proceeding against the property. Under 19 U.S.C. § 608 and § 1610, upon the filing of such claim, the seizing agency transmitted the claim to the United States Attorney for the purpose of initiating a judicial forfeiture action against the property.

Under 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), the United States is required to file a complaint for forfeiture against the property and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the property is subject to forfeiture within 90 days after a claim has been filed in the administrative forfeiture proceedings. That date would have been August 27, 2007, but the Court granted an extension in an Order entered on September 4, 2007 (Dkt. #3), upon agreement of the parties, extending the date to October 12, 2007.

As provided in 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A), the parties wish, by agreement, to again extend the time in which the United States is required to file a complaint for forfeiture against the property and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the property is subject to forfeiture, in order that the parties may have a reasonable and sufficient period in which to evaluate their respective interests in and positions regarding the property.

Claimant knowingly, intelligently, and voluntarily gives up any right he may have under 18 U.S.C. § 983(a)(3)(A)-(C) to require the United States to file a complaint for forfeiture against the property and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the property is subject to forfeiture by October 12, 2007, and any right he may have to seek dismissal of any complaint and/or any forfeiture allegation in an indictment on the ground that it was not filed or returned on or before such date.

The parties agree that the deadline by which the United States shall be required to file a complaint for forfeiture against the property and/or to obtain an indictment alleging that the property is subject to forfeiture shall be extended from Friday, October 12, 2007 to Friday, November 16, 2007.

Claimant agrees that until the United States files a complaint for forfeiture against the property and/or obtains in indictment alleging that the property is subject to forfeiture, or until November 16, 2007, whichever occurs first, the property shall remain in the custody of the United States and Claimant shall not seek its return for any reason in any manner.

Conclusion

The Parties therefore respectfully request that the Court extend the period in which the United States is required to file a complaint against the property subject to forfeiture and/or to obtain in indictment alleging the property is subject to forfeiture to November 16, 2007. Undersigned certifies that the content of the document is acceptable to counsel for Claimant, and that undersigned is authorized to sign for Claimant's counsel. A proposed Order is attached.
