PLEA AGREEMENT (Flip-Flop)

Fast Track 5K3.1

The parties enter into the following agreement:

- 1. Defendant will enter a plea to Count 2 of the complaint, Alien Eluding Examination and Inspection by Immigration Officers of the United States, a misdemeanor offense, in violation of Title 8, United States Code, Section 1325. This plea will occur no later than the time set for the detention hearing/preliminary hearing.
- 2. The government will dismiss Count 1 of the complaint, Illegal Re-Entry After Deportation, a felony, in violation of Title 8, United States Code, Section 1326(a). This charge, if proven, carries a maximum sentence of two (2) years imprisonment, \$250,000

fine, one year supervised release and a \$100 special assessment. The government will dismiss this charge at the time of sentencing.

- 3. The maximum penalties for the offense to which I am pleading are six (6) months in custody, a \$5,000 fine and a \$10 special assessment.
- 4. Pursuant to this plea agreement, the government and the defendant stipulate and agree to a consecutive sentence of sixty days (60) of imprisonment in a United States Marshal Service facility.
- 5. The parties waive a Pre-sentence Report and agree that sentencing will occur on the date of the change of plea.
- 6. Pursuant to this plea, the defendant waives: (1) any right to appeal the Court's entry of judgment against defendant; (2) any right to appeal the imposition of sentence upon defendant under Title 18, United States Code, Section 3742 (sentence appeals); and (3) any right to collaterally attack defendant's conviction and sentence under Title 28, United States Code, Section 2255, or any other collateral attack.

7. Factual Basis for Plea:

I, Daniel QUINONES-Beltran, am a citizen of Mexico. On or about June 25, 2007, at or near Amado, in the District of Arizona, I, Daniel QUINONES-Beltran, was found in the United States. I admit that prior to my re-entry, I was lawfully denied admission, excluded, deported and removed from the United States through Nogales, Arizona on October 26, 2006. I did not obtain the express consent of the Attorney General or the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to re-apply for admission to the United States prior to my illegal entry into the United States. Furthermore, as evidenced by my illegal presence in the United States, I admit that I entered the United States from the Republic of Mexico, at
