ORDER

Petitioner Miguel Angel Platero Diaz, who is confined in the Arizona State Prison Complex-Winslow in Winslow, Arizona, has filed a *pro se* Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2254. He has paid the \$5.00 filing fee. The Court will require an answer to the Petition.

I. Petition

Petitioner was convicted in Maricopa County Superior Court, case #CR-2006-121919-002 DT, of first-degree burglary and was sentenced to a 16-year term of imprisonment. In his Petition, Petitioner names Charles Ryan as Respondent and the Arizona Attorney General as an Additional Respondent.

Petitioner raises three grounds for relief: (1) he was denied effective assistance of counsel during the plea agreement process and at sentencing, in violation of the Sixth and Fourteenth Amendments; (2) he was unconstitutionally sentenced to an aggravated prison

1 term, in violation of the Sixth and Fourteenth Amendments; and (3) he was sentenced using
2 an unconstitutional statute, in violation of the Sixth, Eighth, and Fourteenth Amendments.
3 Petitioner claims all of the grounds have been presented to the Arizona Court of Appeals.

4 The Court will require Respondents to answer the Petition. 28 U.S.C. § 2254(a).

5 **II. Warnings**

6 **A. Address Changes**

7 Petitioner must file and serve a notice of a change of address in accordance with Rule
8 83.3(d) of the Local Rules of Civil Procedure. Petitioner must not include a motion for other
9 relief with a notice of change of address. Failure to comply may result in dismissal of this
10 action.

11 **B. Copies**

12 Petitioner must serve Respondents, or counsel if an appearance has been entered, a
13 copy of every document that he files. Fed. R. Civ. P. 5(a). Each filing must include a
14 certificate stating that a copy of the filing was served. Fed. R. Civ. P. 5(d). Also, Petitioner
15 must submit an additional copy of every filing for use by the Court. LRCiv 5.4. Failure to
16 comply may result in the filing being stricken without further notice to Petitioner.

17 **C. Possible Dismissal**

18 If Petitioner fails to timely comply with every provision of this Order, including these
19 warnings, the Court may dismiss this action without further notice. See Ferdik v. Bonzelet,
20 963 F.2d 1258, 1260-61 (9th Cir. 1992) (a district court may dismiss an action for failure to
21 comply with any order of the Court).

22 **IT IS ORDERED:**

23 (1) The Clerk of Court must serve a copy of the Petition (Doc. #1) and this Order
24 on the Respondent and the Attorney General of the State of Arizona by certified mail
25 pursuant to Rule 4, Rules Governing Section 2254 Cases.


26 (2) Respondents must answer the Petition within 40 days of the date of service.
27 Respondents must not file a dispositive motion in place of an answer but may file an answer
28 limited to relevant affirmative defenses, including but not limited to, statute of limitations,

1 procedural bar, or non-retroactivity. If the answer is limited to affirmative defenses, only
2 those portions of the record relevant to those defenses need be attached to the answer.
3 Failure to set forth an affirmative defense in an answer may be treated as a waiver of the
4 defense. Day v. McDonough, 126 S. Ct. 1675, 1684 (2006). If not limited to affirmative
5 defenses, the answer must fully comply with all of the requirements of Rule 5 of the Rules
6 Governing Section 2254 Cases.

7 (3) Petitioner may file a reply within 30 days from the date of service of the
8 answer.

9 (4) This matter is referred to Magistrate Judge Mark E. Aspey pursuant to Rules
10 72.1 and 72.2 of the Local Rules of Civil Procedure for further proceedings and a report and
11 recommendation.
