15 Plaintiff has filed a document (Doc. 15) that appears to be his response to the  
16 Court's order requiring a more definite statement (Doc. 12) and its subsequent order  
17 requiring Plaintiff to file an amended complaint that complies with the Court's first order  
18 (Doc. 14). The document filed by Plaintiff is not an amended complaint as directed by  
19 the Court. The Court will give Plaintiff one additional opportunity to comply with the  
20 Court's orders and file an amended complaint. If he does not, Plaintiff is warned that this  
21 case will be dismissed for lack of prosecution. Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b).

22 The document filed by Plaintiff is titled "Reply in Support of More Definite  
23 Statement." Doc. 15. That is not the document Plaintiff must file. Rather, Plaintiff must  
24 file an amended complaint (amending the document he first filed in this cases titled  
25 "Complaint"). The amended complaint must comply with the Court's order of  
26 April 9, 2012 (Doc. 12). Specifically, Plaintiff's amended complaint must include  
27 (1) numbered paragraphs, with each paragraph limited to a single allegation or issue,  
28 (2) state the basis for the Court's jurisdiction over this case, (3) set forth factual detail in

support of his claim, such as the detail contained in the written statement attached to his original complaint, (4) set forth the legal basis for his claim (the statute or common law under which he is making a claim), and (5) identify the relief he seeks in this case.

Plaintiff shall file an amended complaint by **June 1, 2012**. Plaintiff is again warned that if he fails to comply with this requirement, the Court will dismiss this case for failure to comply with the Court's orders and for failure to prosecute.
