Movant Sergio Hernandez-Salazar, who is confined in the Central Arizona Detention Center in Florence, Arizona, filed a *pro se* “Motion Under 28 U.S.C. § 2255 to Vacate, Set Aside or Correct Sentence by a Person in Federal Custody” (“Motion”). On May 30, 2012, Movant filed an Amended § 2255 Motion. The Court will deny the Amended Motion with leave to amend.

I. Amended § 2255 Motion

Movant should note that “an amended pleading supersedes the original.” Hal Roach Studios v. Richard Feiner & Co., 896 F.2d 1542, 1546 (9th Cir. 1990) ; King v. Atiyeh, 814 F.2d 565 (9th Cir. 1987). Accordingly, the Court will consider only the claims raised by Movant in his Amended Motion.

On November 9, 2011, Movant entered into a plea agreement to plead guilty to Re-Entry of Removed Alien, in violation of 8 U.S.C. § 1326(a) with a sentencing enhancement pursuant to 8 U.S.C. § 1326(b)(1). The Court rejected the plea agreement and, on March 19, 2012, sentenced Movant to a term of imprisonment of twelve months and one day, followed

1 by three years on supervised release.

2 In his Amended Motion, Movant raises three grounds for relief:

- 3 (1) Movant's last re-entry was ten years prior to his conviction and his second
4 probation ended in 2006;
- 5 (2) Movant signed a plea for four to six months and his attorney told him that he
6 would get time served;
- 7 (3) Both the prosecutor and probation officer recommended Movant be sentenced
8 to eight months and he received twelve months and one day.

9 **II. Leave to Amend**

10 A motion filed pursuant to § 2255 is for a person "claiming the right to be released
11 upon the ground that the sentence was imposed in violation of the Constitution or laws of the
12 United States, or that the court was without jurisdiction to impose such sentence, or that the
13 sentence was in excess of the maximum authorized by law, or is otherwise subject to
14 collateral attack." 28 U.S.C. § 2255. Movant has not argued that his sentence violated the
15 Constitution or laws of the United States, was in excess of the maximum authorized by law,
16 or is otherwise subject to collateral attack. The Court will therefore dismiss the Amended
17 Motion.

18 Within 30 days, Movant may submit a second amended motion on the court-approved
19 form. The Clerk of Court will mail Movant a court-approved form to use for filing a second
20 amended motion. Movant must submit the second amended motion on the court-approved
21 form and sign it under penalty of perjury. If Movant fails to file a second amended motion
22 within 30 days from the date of filing of this Order, the Court will dismiss this § 2255 action
23 without further notice to Movant. If Movant fails to use the court-approved form, the Court
24 may strike the second amended motion and dismiss this § 2255 action without further notice
25 to Movant.

26 Movant must clearly designate on the face of the document that it is a "Second
27 Amended Motion." The second amended motion must be retyped or rewritten in its entirety
28 on a court-approved form and may not incorporate any part of the original Motion or

1 Amended Motion by reference. Movant must describe each ground for relief **and the facts**
2 **supporting each ground.**

3 A second amended motion supersedes an original motion and first amended motion.
4 See Ferdik v. Bonzelet, 963 F.2d 1258, 1262 (9th Cir. 1992); Hal Roach, 896 F.2d at 1546.
5 After amendment, the Court will treat an original motion and first amended motion as
6 nonexistent. Ferdik, 963 F.2d at 1262. Any ground for relief that was raised in the original
7 motion or first amended motion is waived if it is not raised in a second amended motion. See
8 King, 814 F.2d at 567.

9 **III. Warnings**

10 **A. Address Changes**

11 Movant must file and serve a notice of a change of address in accordance with Rule
12 83.3(d) of the Local Rules of Civil Procedure. Movant must not include a motion for other
13 relief with a notice of change of address. Failure to comply may result in dismissal of this
14 § 2255 action.

15 **B. Copies**

16 Movant must submit an additional copy of every filing for use by the Court. See
17 LRCiv 5.4. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the filing being stricken
18 without further notice to Movant.

19 **C. Possible Dismissal**

20 If Movant fails to timely comply with every provision of this Order, including these
21 warnings, the Court may dismiss this § 2255 action without further notice. See Ferdik, 963
22 F.2d at 1260-61 (a district court may dismiss an action for failure to comply with any order
23 of the Court).


24 **IT IS ORDERED:**

25 (1) Movant's Amended Motion Under 28 U.S.C. § 2255 to Vacate, Set Aside or
26 Correct Sentence by a Person in Federal Custody (Doc. 3 in CV 12-1035-PHX-DGC (SPL))
27 is **denied with leave to amend**. Movant has **30 days** from the date of filing of this Order to
28 file a second amended motion in compliance with this Order.

1 (2) If Movant fails to file a second amended motion within 30 days, the Clerk of
2 Court must, without further notice, terminate Document 22 in CR 11-2209-PHX-DGC and
3 enter a judgment of dismissal of the civil action opened in connection with this § 2255 action
4 (CV 12-1035-PHX-DGC (SPL)), without prejudice.

5 (3) The Clerk of Court must mail Movant a court-approved form for filing a
6 Motion to Vacate, Set Aside or Correct Sentence By a Person in Federal Custody (28 U.S.C.
7 § 2255).

**Instructions for Filing a Motion to Vacate, Set Aside, or Correct a Sentence
by a Person in Federal Custody (Motion Under 28 U.S.C. § 2255)
in the United States District Court for the District of Arizona**

1. Who May Use This Form. To use this form, you must be a person who is serving a sentence under a judgment against you in a federal court. You also may use this form to challenge a federal judgment that imposed a sentence to be served in the future. You are asking for relief from the conviction or the sentence. This form is your motion for relief. In this motion, you may challenge only one judgment. If you want to challenge more than one judgment, you must file a separate motion for each judgment. **This form should not be used in death penalty cases.** If you were sentenced to death, you are entitled to the assistance of counsel and you should request the appointment of counsel.

2. The Form. **Local Rule of Civil Procedure (LRCiv) 3.5(a) requires that motions to vacate must be filed on the court-approved form.** The form must be typed or neatly handwritten. All questions must be answered clearly and concisely in the appropriate space on the form. If needed, you may attach additional pages. The form, however, must be completely filled in to the extent applicable. You do not need to cite law. If you want to file a brief or arguments, you must attach a separate memorandum.

3. Your Signature. You must tell the truth and sign the form. If you make a false statement of a material fact, you may be prosecuted for perjury.

4. No Filing Fee. No fee is required with this motion.

5. Original and Judge's Copy. You must send an **original and one copy** of your motion and of any other document submitted to the Court. You must send one additional copy to the Court if you wish to have a file-stamped copy of the document returned to you. All copies must be identical to the original. Copies may be legibly handwritten.

6. Where to File. You must file the form in the United States District Court that entered the judgment that you are challenging. When you have completed the form, mail the **original and one copy** to the Clerk of the United States District Court at the division where you were sentenced:

7. Change of Address. You must immediately notify the Court and respondents in writing of any change in your mailing address. **Failure to notify the Court of any change in your mailing address may result in the dismissal of your case.**

8. Certificate of Service. You must provide the respondent with a copy of any document you submit to the Court (except the initial motion to vacate). Each original document (except the initial motion to vacate) must include a certificate of service on the last page of the document stating the date a copy of the document was mailed to the respondent and the address to which it was mailed. Fed. R. Civ. P. 5(a), (d). Any document received by the Court that does not include a certificate of service may be stricken. A certificate of service should be in the following form:

9. Amended Motion to Vacate. If you need to change any of the information in the initial motion to vacate, you must file an amended motion. The amended motion must be written on the court-approved motion to vacate form. You may file one amended motion without leave (permission) of Court before the respondent has answered your original motion to vacate. See Fed. R. Civ. P. 15(a). After the respondent has filed an answer, you must file a motion for leave to amend and lodge (submit) a proposed amended motion to vacate. LRCiv 15.1. An amended motion may not incorporate by reference any part of your prior motion. LRCiv 15.1(a)(2). Any grounds not included in the amended motion to vacate are considered dismissed.

10. Letters and Motions. It is generally inappropriate to write a letter to any judge or the staff of any judge. The only appropriate way to communicate with the Court is by filing a written pleading or motion.

11. Grounds for Relief. You must raise all grounds for relief that relate to this conviction or sentence. Any grounds not raised in this motion will likely be barred from being raised at a later date.

FINAL NOTE

You should follow these instructions carefully. Failure to do so may result in your motion being stricken or dismissed by the Court. All questions must be answered concisely in the proper space on the form. If you need more space, you may attach additional pages. But the form must be completely filled in to the extent applicable. If you attach additional pages, be sure to identify which section of the motion is being continued and number all pages.
