At the hearing on January 14, 2009, plaintiff had the opportunity to testify as to her claim that defendants failed to send all of her medications with her when she was transported to the Clark County Jail for court purposes, causing her to have a seizure. There was no testimony as to that claim or the claim plaintiff now makes that Dr. Anderson deliberately withheld her seizure medication.
