Dear Judge Marshall:

In its December 13, 2013, Order (ECF Doc. #30), the Court overruled Amtrak's objection to Haukereid's Interrogatory 16 and Request for Production 16 and ordered Amtrak to "produce the investigation reports for every incident involving a passenger who fell out of a door while a train was between stops." Despite Haukereid's requests, Amtrak has refused to produce investigation reports or descriptions of incidents for fourteen prior incidents.

For seven prior incidents, Amtrak denies having a responsive police investigation report and refuses to provide a "description of the incident" as requested by Interrogatory 16. Haukereid believes Amtrak too narrowly interprets the Court's Order.

For the other seven prior incidents, Amtrak states the passengers "did not exit through a door" and the incidents fall outside the Court's Order. Haukereid believes Amtrak will tell the Court these seven passengers exited a moving train through a window. However, the windows are within the exit doors. Haukereid believes Amtrak too narrowly interprets the Court's Order.

Due to the tight timeline, Haukereid requests a short telephone conference with the Court to discuss prior incidents.
