ORDER

Pending before the Court is Plaintiff's motion requesting an award of attorney's fees and expenses under the Equal Access to Justice Act ("EAJA"), 28 U.S.C. § 2412. Doc. 20. The Commissioner has filed a Response. Doc. 22.

Plaintiff's attorney, Stephanie Bartels Wallace, requests a total payment of \$2,582.02, consisting of: (1) 10.45 hours of attorney work in 2017-18 at the hourly rate of \$196.00 (\$2,048.20); (2) 6.85 hours of paralegal work at the hourly rate of \$75.00 (\$513.75); and (3) \$20.07 in expenses. The Commissioner does not object to the requested amount.

Under these circumstances, the Court concludes that Plaintiff is entitled to an award of attorney's fees and expenses under the EAJA, and that the amount requested is reasonable.

¹On April 4, 2018, the Court entered an Order and Judgment reversing the Commissioner's decision and remanding this case for further administrative proceedings. *Docs.* 16 & 17.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Plaintiff's Amended Motion for Attorney's Fees and Expenses Pursuant to the EAJA, *Doc. 20* is GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff is awarded \$2,582.02 in attorney's fees and expenses under the EAJA.²

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT Plaintiff's original Motion for Attorney's Fees and Expenses, *Doc. 18*, is DENIED as MOOT.
