ORDER

Pending are Plaintiff's Motions for Reconsideration¹ of my orders denying his motions to remand these related cases to state court. I see no reason to hold a hearing on this matter, and the Motions are hereby DENIED.

In the event that his Motions for Reconsideration are denied, Plaintiff requests a sixtyday "delay . . . [for] the filing of a pleading to address the Complaint and to substitute Council [sic] for the presentation of a more comprehensive Pleading." Although I deny his request for a sixty-day delay, Plaintiff raises a good point. Even though he is a part-owner in Plaintiff Doctor's Testing Center LLC II ("Doctor's Testing"), Mr. Davis may not represent Doctor's Testing in federal court because he is not a licensed attorney.² Mr. Davis is directed to obtain an attorney to represent Doctor's Testing within twenty days from the date of this Order. Defendants' pending motions to dismiss and consolidate, and request for a stay of Rule 26
