ORDER

The Court has received proposed findings and recommendations (Doc. 31) from United

States Magistrate Judge Mark E. Ford. The Court has also received Petitioner Quincy J. Plessy's objections (Doc. 33). The Magistrate recommends denying Mr. Plessy a certificate of appealability and denying leave to appeal in forma pauperis, as the Magistrate found no substantive issues that were debatable among reasonable jurists. Plessy objects that reasonable jurists could debate whether
