APPLICATION FOR AN ORDER TO ALLOW CONFIDENTIAL

RECORDS TO BE FILED UNDER SEAL

On February 10, 2005, Defendant filed its Ex Parte Application for an Order to Allow Confidential Records to Be Filed under Seal. On February 22, 2005, this matter was assigned to this Court due to the self-recusal of the Honorable George P. Schiavelli.

The Court has reviewed and considered Defendant's unopposed ex parte application. The Court finds that Defendant has failed to show that there is good cause to file these documents under seal.

The potential customers are numerous and fairly obvious. Defendant has not suggested any great effort expended to identify which entities among the hundreds or thousands of potential customers it chose to target. It does not appear to the Court that significant or unique costing information appears in the documents identified, except to a very limited extent. Some of the information Defendant apparently seeks to have sealed is information that must, due to its nature, be public. The public is entitled to know how Defendant's system works in order to address the criminal prosecutions that result from the use by municipalities of Defendant's systems. The Court will not order the sealing of an entire document merely because portions of a page or pages contain confidential information.
