**ORDER OF PREJUDICIAL
 DISMISSAL OF ENTIRE ACTION**

NOTE: CHANGES MADE BY THE COURT

25 Having read the concurrently submitted stipulation by the parties for an order
 26 of prejudicial dismissal of the entire action, and good cause appearing therefor, the
 27 Honorable Percy Anderson, United States District Judge for the Central District of
 28 California, does hereby order as follows:

1 1. All defendants, including all fictitious defendants, are hereby dismissed
2 with prejudice to any refile of this action in this or any other federal or state court.
3 This prohibition is irrevocable and applies regardless of the causes of action selected
4 and the allegations made, as long as the allegations substantially relate to the events
5 which are or could have been described in the complaint giving rise to the current
6 litigation.

7 2. The consideration for this prejudicial dismissal of the named and
8 fictitious defendants is stated in a separate settlement agreement between the parties.

9 3. The plaintiffs, both collectively and individually, fully and permanently
10 waive any and all past, present, and future: special (also known as economic)
11 damages; general (also known as non-economic) damages; punitive and exemplary
12 damages; equitable and declaratory relief; the fees of attorneys, whether of record or
13 not; discovery rights; and ordinary and expert costs, whether incurred or paid.

14 4. As a result of the prejudicial dismissal of all aspects of the litigation in
15 this or any other federal or state court, regarding all named and fictitious defendants,
16 the Court orders that all pending and future litigation events and deadlines, including
17 the 16(b) conference, any pretrial conference, and trial, are now vacated as
18 unnecessary.

19 ~~5. The Court does, however, retain jurisdiction over the subject matter of~~
20 ~~this litigation in the event that any dispute concerning the meaning or enforcement of~~
21 ~~the settlement agreement should arise between the parties.~~
