Plaintiff filed an unlawful detainer complaint on 22 November 19, 2012. On March 22, 2013, Defendant removed to this court on the basis of federal question jurisdiction. (Notice of 23 2.4 Removal at 3.) 25 Under 28 U.S.C. § 1441(b), a defendant may remove to federal 26

Under 28 U.S.C. § 1441(b), a defendant may remove to federal court "[a]ny civil action of which the district courts have original jurisdiction founded on a claim or right arising under the Constitution, treaties or laws of the United States . . . "

"Under the longstanding well-pleaded complaint rule, however, a suit 'arises under' federal law only when the plaintiff's statement of his own cause of action shows that it is based upon federal law." <u>Vaden v. Discover Bank</u>, 556 U.S. 49, 60 (2009) (internal quotation marks and citation omitted). "Federal law cannot be predicated on an actual or anticipated defense Nor can federal question jurisdiction rest upon an actual or anticipated counterclaim." Id. (citations omitted) Here, nothing on the face of Plaintiff's complaint suggests a federal question.

The court notes that Defendants have the burden of establishing removal jurisdiction. Accordingly, the court orders Defendants to file a brief, not to exceed ten pages, by Monday, June 10, 2013 showing cause why this action should not be remanded for lack of jurisdiction. Defendants should also deliver a courtesy copy to chambers, Room 244-J, Second Floor, 312 N. Spring Street, Los Angeles. The court will regard any failure to file an explanatory brief as consent to remand this matter to state court.
