The amended complaint, bearing the number 8 CV 13-4929-JAK (SH), must be a complete and independent document and must 9 not refer to prior pleadings. Plaintiff is cautioned that failure to file a first amended 10 complaint within the time specified by this Order may result in dismissal of the action with prejudice on the grounds stated in the Report and Recommendation of 11 the United States Magistrate Judge and/or for failure to prosecute. 12

In preparing a first amended complaint, Plaintiff must bear in mind the
deficiencies of the current pleading, and must assure that they are not repeated.
Plaintiff must take particular note of the following guidelines:

- Plaintiff must set forth the jurisdictional grounds for his claims at the
