**COMPLAINT FOR PATENT
INFRINGEMENT**

DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL

22 COMES NOW, Plaintiff EVERYMD.COM LLC ("Plaintiff" or "EveryMD"),
23 and on information and belief alleges as follows:

24 **JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

25 1. This is an action for patent infringement under 35 U.S.C. §§ 271 et. seq.
26 and 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and 1338(a).

27 2. The acts of patent infringement alleged herein occurred within this
28 judicial district, Plaintiff resides in this district, and Defendant GOOGLE INC.

1 (“Defendant” or “Google”) is subject to personal jurisdiction in this district.
2 Therefore, venue is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1391(b), (c), and 1400(b).
3

4 **PARTIES**

5 3. Plaintiff is a California Limited Liability Company with a place of
6 business at 2032 Whitley Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90068.

7 4. Defendant is a Delaware Corporation with a place of business at 1600
8 Amphitheatre Parkway, Mountain View, CA 94043.
9

10 **FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION**
11 **PATENT INFRINGEMENT**

12 5. Plaintiff incorporates by reference paragraphs 1 – 4 as though fully set
13 forth herein.

14 6. Plaintiff owns the website www.everymd.com.

15 7. Plaintiff’s website at www.everymd.com has since the year 2000
16 provided email messaging services allowing patients to communicate with over
17 300,000 doctors.

18 8. Plaintiff’s principals Frank Weyer and Troy Javaher (collectively, “the
19 EveryMD inventors”) invented numerous novel technologies and inventions during
20 development of the www.everymd.com website.

21 9. On November 23, 1999, the EveryMD inventors filed U.S. Patent
22 Application Serial No. 09/447,755 entitled “Method Apparatus and Business System
23 for Online Communications with Online and Offline Recipients” disclosing the
24 inventions made by the EveryMD inventors while developing the www.everymd.com
25 website.
26

27 10. To date, four separate patents covering four separate inventions have
28 issued from the patent application originally filed in November 1999. Those patents

1 are U.S. Patent Nos. 6,671,714 (issued December 30, 2003), 7,644,122 (issued
2 January 5, 2010), 8,499,047 (issued July 30, 2013), and 8,504,631 (issued August 6,
3 2013).
4

5 11. Plaintiff is the assignee of record of U.S. Patent 8,504,631 entitled
6 “Method, Apparatus and Business System for Online Communications with Online
7 and Offline Recipients” (“the ‘631 patent”).

8 12. The ‘631 patent is valid and in full force and effect.

9 13. The ‘631 patent is directed to a novel method for providing notification
10 of online messages to a telephone number of a recipient.

11 14. Defendants Google+ service directly infringes the ‘631 patent by
12 practicing the claimed invention of the ‘631 patent without authorization of Plaintiff.
13

14 15. One example of how Defendant’s Google+ service directly infringes
15 claim 1 of the ‘631 patent is set forth in paragraphs 16 to 26 below.

16 16. The preamble of claim 1 of the ‘631 patent states:

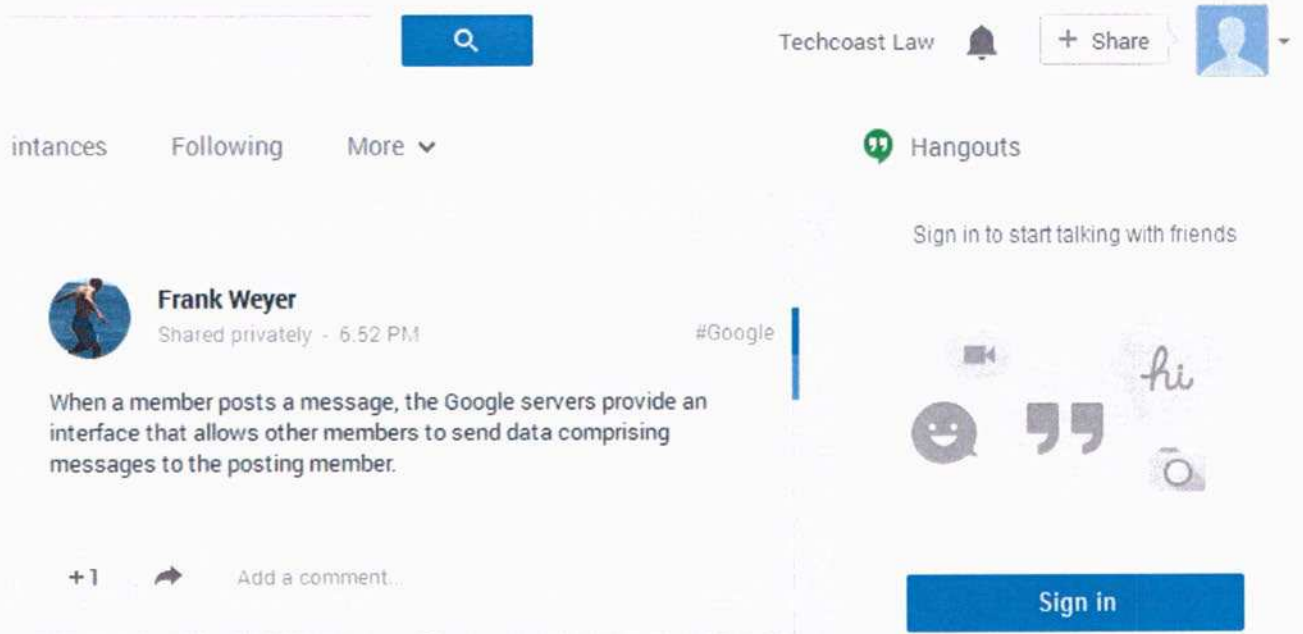
17 *“1. A method for providing for communications by a server computer system
18 among a first member of a group of members for whom said server computer system
19 has created a first server created email box and a second member of said group of
20 members for whom said server computer system has created a second server created
21 email box, said method comprising the steps of:”*

22 17. Google’s Google+ service provides communications between Google+
23 members. For each Google+ member, Google’s server computer system creates an
24 email box, typically an “@gmail.com” email box. Examples of email boxes created
25 by Google’s server computer system are “frank.weyer@gmail.com” (first server
26 created mailbox for first member “Frank Weyer”) and “techcoastlaw@gmail.com”
27 (second server created mailbox for second member “Techcoast Law”).
28

1 18. The limitation of claim 1 that follows the preamble of claim 1 of the '631
2 patent states:

4 *“said server computer system transmitting a first server created web page to a*
5 *first internet access device of said second member, said first server created web page*
6 *comprising a message interface for receiving by said server computer system input*
7 *data comprising a first message to said first member;”*.

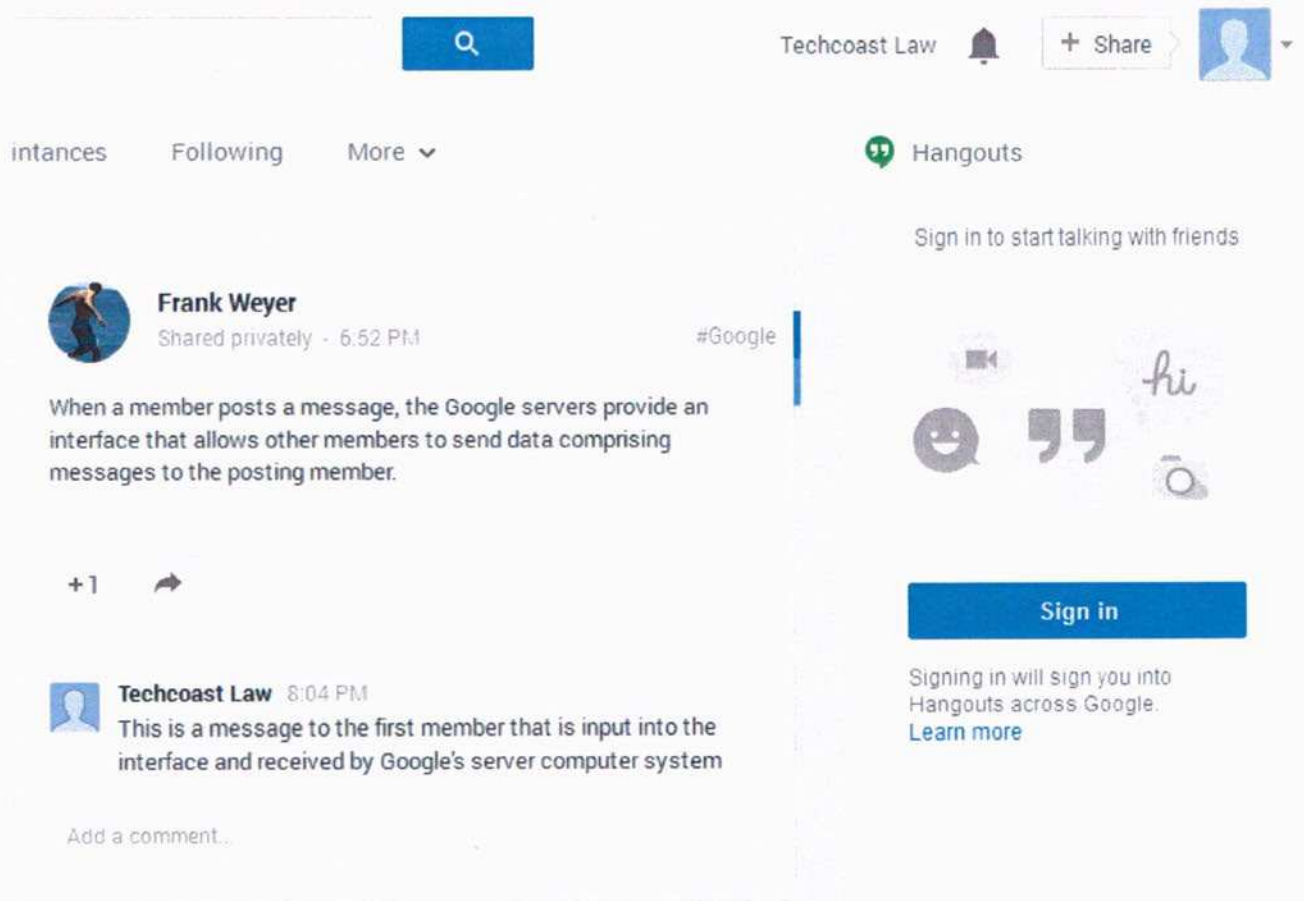
8 19. Google’s server computer system transmits various server created web
9 pages to an internet access device of a member (i.e. a “second member”) that provide
10 message interfaces for receiving data comprising messages to another member (i.e. the
11 “first member”). The screen capture below shows an example of such a “first server
12 created web page” that includes such a “message interface.” In the screen capture
13 below, the web page including the message interface has been provided to the second
14 member “Techcoast Law” for receiving data comprising a first message (“Comment”) to
15 first member “Frank Weyer.”



27 20. The next limitation of claim 1 of the '631 patent states:
28

1 “said server computer system receiving first input data entered into said
2 message interface from said first internet access device of said second member;”
3

4 21. When the second member enters input data into the message interface
5 from the second member’s internet access device, the first input data is received by
6 Google’s server computer system, as indicated by the input data now being displayed
7 as a received message with an indicated time of receipt on the web page provided by
8 the Google server computer system, as shown in the screen capture below. In the
9 screen capture below, the web page indicates that the input data was received by
10 Google’s server computer system from the internet access device of “second” member
11 “Techcoast Law” at “8:04 PM”:



22. The next limitation of claim 1 of the ‘631 patent states:

1 “said server computer system sending a second message to a telephone number
2 associated with said first member notifying said first member of said first input data;”
3

4 23. Google+ allows members to indicate a telephone number at which to
5 receive notifications of online messages. The screen capture below shows the
6 different kinds of notifications the Google server computer system is configured to
7 send to a member’s telephone number:

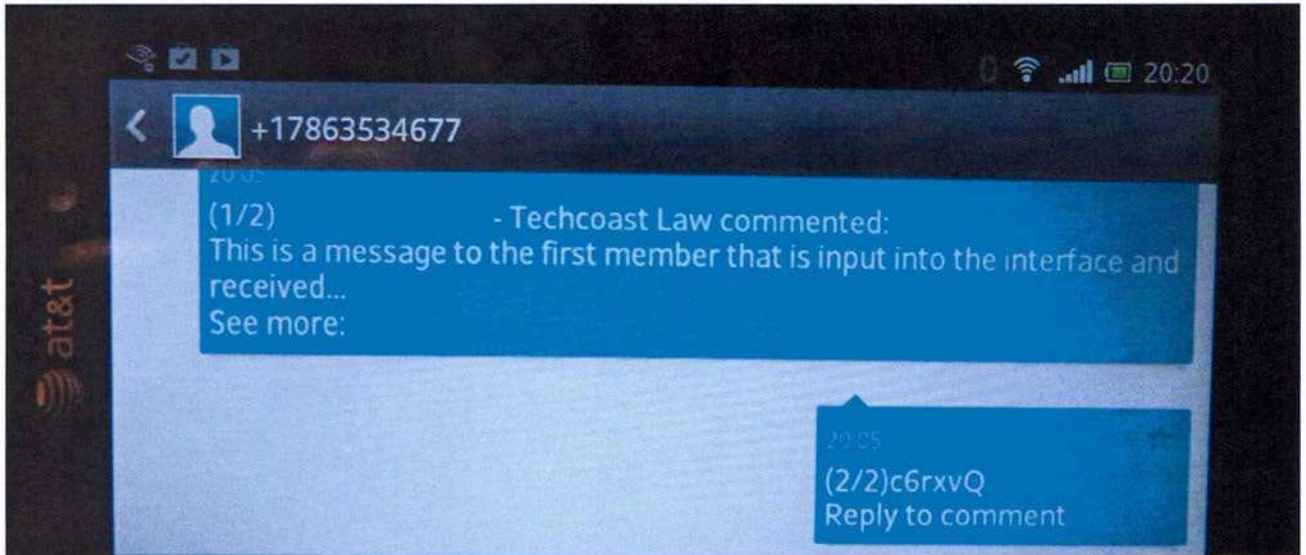

2 24. If a member has elected to receive phone notifications, Google's server
3 computer system sends an SMS message ("second message") to the telephone number
4 of the first member notifying the first member of the data input into the message
5 interface by the second member. Below is a photograph of an example of such an
6 SMS message sent to the first member's telephone number:



16 25. The last limitation of claim 1 of the '631 patent states:

17 *"said server computer system sending a third message to said first server*
18 *created email box of said first member, said third message comprising said first input*
19 *data."*

20 26. Google+ allows members to receive notifications of messages input by
21 other members via their gmail mailboxes. If a member has elected to receive gmail
22 notifications, Google's server computer system sends an email ("third message") to
23 Google server created gmail email box comprising the first input data. Below is a
24 screen capture of such a "third message" sent by the Google server computer system
25 to the first server created email address "frank.weyer@gmail.com" of first member
26 "Frank Weyer":

15 27. Plaintiff has provided constructive notice of the '631 patent by marking
16 the www.everymd.com website with the '631 patent number.

17 28. Defendant has constructive and actual notice of Plaintiff's patent rights
18 but Defendant continues to act in conscious and willful disregard of those rights.

19 29. Defendant's infringements of Plaintiff's patent rights have irreparably
20 damaged Plaintiff and will continue to cause irreparable harm unless enjoined by the
21 Court.

1 **DEMAND FOR RELIEF**

2
3 **WHEREFORE**, Plaintiff asks this Court to:

4 a. Enter judgment for Plaintiff against Defendant on this Complaint;

5 b. Enter a preliminary and permanent injunction to enjoin Defendant, and
6 all those in privity with Defendant, from further infringement of the '631 patent
7 during the remaining term of the patent;

8 c. Award compensatory damages to Plaintiff and to increase those damages
9 three times in accordance with 35 U.S.C. § 284;

10 d. Award Plaintiff reasonable attorneys' fees in accordance with 35 U.S.C.
11 § 285;

12 e. Award Plaintiff interest and costs; and

13 f. Award Plaintiff such other and further relief as is just and proper.

15 **DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL**

16 Plaintiff hereby demands a trial by jury of all issues so triable.
