4	against Defendants Lopez-Flores and Redding, Defendants' request for		
5	dismissal based upon qualified immunity, and Defendants' request to strike		
6	Plaintiff's request for punitive damages;		
7	(4) Defendants' Motion For Protective Order (Docket 25) is DENIED and the		
8	stay of discovery ordered on April 21, 2015 is VACATED; and		
9	(5) Defendants Lopez- Flores and Redding shall file an Answer to the Complaint		
10	within 21 days of the Court's Order
