6	States District Judge presiding, on the motion of Plaintiff Microsoft Corporation		
7	("Microsoft") for default judgment and a permanent injunction against Defendant		
8	Calistech, a California corporation ("Calistech"). The evidence presented having		
9	been fully considered and a decision having been duly rendered,		
10	IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that,		
11	1. By its unauthorized distribution of Microsoft's trademarks and service		
12	mark in commerce and in connection with Microsoft windows 7 software,		
13	Defendant Cansteen has mininged the following registered trademarks and service		
14	mark owned by Microsoft.		
15	a. 1,200,236 ("MICROSOFT");		
16	b. 1,872,264 ("WINDOWS");		
17	c. 2,744,843 (COLORED FLAG DESIGN); and		
18	d. 3,361,017 (COLORED FLAG START BUTTON).		
19 20	2. Calistech has also infringed Microsoft's registered copyright in the		
20	following work: TX 7-009-361 ("Windows 7").		
21	3. Calistech's use of Microsoft's marks has resulted in the placement in		
22 23	commerce of mininging items that are surkingly similar to genuine wherosoft, of		
23 24	where solve the enset of the en		
24 25	deception in the market as to the source of those items.		
23 26	4. By its trafficking in counterfeit and illicit Microsoft Certificate of		
20 27	Authenticity Labels, Calistech has violated the Anti-Counterfeiting Amendments		
28	Act of 2004, 18 U.S.C. § 2318.		

5. Calistech's distribution of infringing Microsoft software also
 constitutes federal false designation of origin, false description and false
 representation (15 U.S.C. § 1125 et seq.), and unfair competition under California
 common law.

6. By misrepresenting to Microsoft that it would abide by the terms of the
Registered Refurbisher Program in order to obtain access to Microsoft Registered
Refurbisher Certificates of Authenticity and Product Keys, when it had no intention
of doing so, Calistech is liable to Microsoft for fraud in the inducement, conversion
and unjust enrichment.

7. The likelihood of confusion that existed in this instance by virtue of
 Calistech's distribution of counterfeit, infringing and illicit Microsoft software
 components in interstate commerce is an appropriate predicate upon which to base
 permanent injunctive relief against the unauthorized reproduction, replication
 and/or distribution by Calistech of any unauthorized, illegal, and/or counterfeit
 Microsoft items. This Court contemporaneously issues a separate permanent
 injunction.

17 8. Microsoft is awarded \$30,000 in statutory damages against Calistech18 under the Copyright Act.

19 9. Microsoft is awarded \$800,000 in statutory damages against Calistech20 under the Lanham Act.

21 10. Microsoft is awarded \$25,000 in statutory damages against Calistech
22 under the Anti-Counterfeiting Amendments Act of 2004.

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11. Microsoft is awarded \$20,700 in attorneys' fees and costs.

12. The total judgment against Calistech is \$875,700.

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1	13. This judgment shall accrue interest, compounded annually, pursuant to
2	28 U.S.C. § 1961.
