This Court, having considered the Preliminary Injunction (“Order”), the filings by the Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”) in support of the Order, and the other filings in this case, and for other cause appearing, hereby orders that:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1
2 1. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case and
3 over Defendants.

4
5 2. Venue in this district, process, and service of process are proper.

6 3. There is good cause to believe that Defendants Sale Slash, LLC, a
7 California limited liability company, Purists Choice LLC, a California limited
8 liability company, Artur Babayan, and Vahe Haroutounian have engaged and are
9 likely to continue to engage in acts or practices that violate Sections 5(a) and 12 of
10 the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 45(a) & 52, and Section 5(a) of the CAN-SPAM Act,
11 15 U.S.C. § 7704(a), and that the FTC is therefore likely to prevail on the merits of
12 this action.
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16 4. There is good cause to believe that consumers will suffer immediate
17 and continuing harm from Defendants' ongoing violations of Section 5(a) and 12
18 of the FTC Act and Section 5(a) of the CAN-SPAM Act unless Defendants are
19 restrained and enjoined by order of this Court.
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21

22 5. There is good cause to believe that immediate and irreparable damage
23 to the Court's ability to grant effective final relief for consumers in the form of
24 monetary restitution and/or disgorgement of ill-gotten gains will occur from the
25 transfer, dissipation, or concealment by Defendants of their assets or business
26 records unless Defendants are immediately restrained and enjoined by order of this
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1 Court. Therefore, there is good cause for an asset freeze and the appointment of a
2 permanent receiver over the Corporate Defendants;

3 6. Weighing the equities and considering the FTC's likelihood of
4 ultimate success, this Order is in the public interest.
5

6 7. No security is required of any agency of the United States for issuance
7 of a preliminary injunction, Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c).
8

9 DEFINITIONS

10 For the purposes of this Order, the following definitions shall apply:
11

12 1. "Asset" or "Assets" means any legal or equitable interest in, right to,
13 or claim to, any real or personal property, including, but not limited to, "goods,"
14 "instruments," "equipment," "fixtures," "general intangibles," "inventory,"
15 "checks," or "notes" (as these terms are defined in the Uniform Commercial
16 Code), lines of credit, chattels, leaseholds, contracts, mail or other deliveries,
17 shares of stock, lists of consumer names, accounts, credits, premises, receivables,
18 funds, and all cash, wherever located.
19

20 2. "Assisting others" includes, but is not limited to: (a) performing
21 customer service functions, including, but not limited to, receiving or responding
22 to consumer complaints; (b) formulating or providing, or arranging for the
23 formulation or provision of, any sales script or other marketing material;
24 (c) providing names of, or assisting in the generation of, potential customers;
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1 (d) performing or providing marketing or billing services of any kind; (e) acting as
2 an officer or director of a business entity; (f) hosting websites; or (g) processing
3 payments.
4

5 3. **“Clear and conspicuous”** and **“clearly and conspicuously”** means
6 that a required disclosure is difficult to miss (i.e., easily noticeable) and easily
7 understandable by ordinary consumers, including in all of the following ways:
8

9 a. In any communication that is solely visual or solely audible, the
10 disclosure must be made through the same means through which the
11 communication is presented. In any communication made through both visual and
12 audible means, such as a television advertisement, the disclosure must be presented
13 simultaneously in both the visual and audible portions of the communication, even
14 if the representation requiring the disclosure is made in only one means.
15
16

17 b. A visual disclosure, by its size, contrast, location, the length of
18 time it appears, and other characteristics, must stand out from any accompanying
19 text or other visual elements so that it is easily noticed, read, and understood.
20
21

22 c. An audible disclosure, including by telephone or streaming
23 video, must be delivered in a volume, speed, and cadence sufficient for ordinary
24 consumers to easily hear and understand it.
25

26 d. In any communication using an interactive electronic medium,
27 such as the Internet or software, the disclosure must be unavoidable.
28

1 e. The disclosure must use diction and syntax understandable to
2 ordinary consumers and must appear in each language in which the representation
3 that requires the disclosure appears.
4

5 f. The disclosure must comply with these requirements in each
6 medium through which it is received, including all electronic devices and face-to-
7 face communications.
8

9 g. The disclosure must not be contradicted or mitigated by, or
10 inconsistent with, anything else in the communication.
11

12 4. **“Commercial electronic mail message”** (or **“commercial email”**)
13 means any electronic mail message the primary purpose of which is the
14 commercial advertisement or promotion of a commercial product or service
15 (including the content on an Internet website operated for commercial purposes).
16
17 15 U.S.C. § 7702(2).
18

19 5. **“Competent and reliable scientific evidence”** means tests, analyses,
20 research, or studies that have been conducted and evaluated in an objective manner
21 by qualified persons and are generally accepted in the profession to yield accurate
22 and reliable results.
23

24 6. **“Corporate Defendants”** or **“Receivership Defendants”** means Sale
25 Slash, LLC, a California limited liability company, and Purists Choice LLC, a
26 California limited liability company, and their successors and assigns, as well as
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1 any subsidiaries, and any fictitious business entities or business names created or
2 used by these entities.

3
4 7. **“Covered Product”** means any dietary supplement, food, or drug,
5 including, but not limited to, Premium Green Coffee, Premium Raspberry Ketone,
6 Pure Caralluma Fimbriata Extract, Pure Forskolin Extract, Pure Garcinia
7 Cambogia, Pure Garcinia Cambogia HCA, Pure Saffron, and Pure White Kidney
8 Bean Extract.
9

10
11 8. **“Defendants”** means all of the Individual Defendants and the
12 Corporate Defendants, individually, collectively, or in any combination.

13
14 9. **“Document”** or **“Documents”** means any materials listed in Federal
15 Rule of Civil Procedure 34(a), and includes writings, drawings, graphs, charts,
16 photographs, audio and video recordings, computer records, and other data
17 compilations from which information can be obtained and translated, if necessary,
18 through detection devices into reasonably usable form. A draft or non-identical
19 copy is a separate document within the meaning of the term.
20

21
22 10. **“Financial Institution”** means any bank, savings and loan institution,
23 credit union, or any financial depository of any kind, including, but not limited to,
24 any brokerage house, trustee, broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company,
25 commodity trading company, or precious metal dealer.
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1 11. “**Header Information**” means the source, destination, and routing
2 information attached to an electronic mail message, including the originating
3 domain name and originating electronic mail address, and any other information
4 that appears in the line identifying, or purporting to identify, a person initiating the
5 message. 15 U.S.C. § 7702(8).
6

7
8 12. “**Individual Defendants**” means Artur Babayan and Vahe
9 Haroutounian, or by whatever other name each may be known.
10

11 13. “**Initiate**,” when used with respect to a commercial electronic mail
12 message, means to originate or transmit such message or to procure the origination
13 or transmission of such message. 15 U.S.C. § 7702(9).
14

15 14. “**Person**” means a natural person, an organization or other legal
16 entity, including a corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship, limited liability
17 company, association, cooperative, or any other group or combination acting as an
18 entity.
19

20 15. “**Plaintiff**,” “**Commission**,” or “**FTC**” means the Federal Trade
21 Commission.
22

23 16. “**Procure**,” when used with respect to the initiation of a commercial
24 electronic mail message, means intentionally to pay or provide other consideration
25 to, or induce, another person to initiate such a message on one’s behalf. 15 U.S.C.
26 § 7702(12).
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1 17. “**Receivership Defendants**” means Sale Slash, LLC, a California
2 limited liability company and Purists Choice LLC, a California limited liability
3 company, and their successors and assigns, as well as any subsidiaries, affiliates,
4 divisions, or sales or customer service operations, and any fictitious business
5 entities or business names created or used by these entities, including, but not
6 limited to, Apex Customer Care LLC, a California limited liability company, E-
7 Level Marketing Inc., a California corporation, Future DNA LLC, a California
8 limited liability company, Geneva Shox LLC, a California limited liability
9 company, Genix Marketing LLC, a California limited liability company, Lead
10 Kings LLC, a California limited liability company, Optim Products LLC, a
11 California limited liability company, Penway LLC, a California limited liability
12 company, Renvee LLC, a California limited liability company, and Vita Fuse LLC,
13 a California limited liability company.
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19 18. “**Sender**” means a person who initiates a commercial electronic mail
20 message and whose product, service, or Internet website is advertised or promoted
21 by the message. 15 U.S.C. § 7702(16).
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23 19. “**TRO**” means the *Ex Parte* Temporary Restraining Order with an
24 Asset Freeze, Appointment of a Receiver, and Other Equitable Relief, and Order to
25 Show Cause Why a Preliminary Injunction Should Not Issue entered by this Court
26 on April 27, 2015.
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I.

PROHIBITED WEIGHT-LOSS CLAIMS

IT IS ORDERED that Defendants and their officers, agents, servants, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly, in connection with the manufacturing, labeling, advertising, promotion, offering for sale, sale, or distribution of any Covered Product, are hereby restrained and enjoined from making, or assisting others in making, directly or by implication, including through the use of a product name, endorsement, depiction, or illustration, any representation, that:

A. Such Covered Product causes, or assists in causing, weight loss, or any specific amount of weight loss;

B. Such Covered Product causes, or assists in causing, rapid weight loss; or

C. Consumers who use the Covered Product can generally expect to achieve the weight loss results represented by an endorser of such Covered Product; unless the representation is non-misleading and, at the time of making such representation, Defendants possess and rely upon competent and reliable scientific evidence, as that term is defined above, that is sufficient in quality and quantity

1 based on standards generally accepted in the scientific fields, when considered in
2 light of the entire body of relevant and reliable scientific evidence, to substantiate
3 the representation is true.

6 **PROHIBITED MISREPRESENTATIONS**

7
8 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,
9 servants, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or
10 participation with any of them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal
11 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation,
12 subsidiary, division, or other device, in connection with the advertising, marketing,
13 promotion, offering for sale, or sale of any Covered Product, are hereby restrained
14 and enjoined from misrepresenting, or assisting others in misrepresenting, directly
15 or indirectly, expressly or by implication, any material fact, including, but not
16 limited to, that Defendants' products are or have been used, endorsed, or approved
17 by specifically identified celebrities such as Oprah Winfrey and The Doctors
18 television show.
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23 **III.**

24 **PROHIBITIONS AGAINST**
25 **COMMERCIAL EMAIL MISREPRESENTATIONS**

26 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,
27 servants, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or
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1 participation with any of them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal
2 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation,
3 subsidiary, division, or other device, in connection with the advertising, marketing,
4 promotion, offering for sale, or sale of any product, service, or program, are hereby
5 restrained and enjoined from initiating the transmission of a commercial email that:
6

7
8 A. Contains, or is accompanied by, materially false or materially
9 misleading header information, including but not limited to:

10 1. an originating electronic mail address, domain name, or Internet
11 Protocol address when the access to such originating electronic email address,
12 domain name or Internet Protocol address was obtained by means of false or
13 fraudulent pretenses or representations; or
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16 2. a "from" line (the line identifying or purporting to identify the
17 person initiating the messages) that does not accurately identify any person who
18 initiated the message; or
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20 B. Contains a subject heading likely to mislead recipients, acting
21 reasonably under the circumstances, about material facts regarding the contents or
22 subject matter of the message.
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25 **IV.**

26 **PROHIBITIONS AGAINST**
27 **OPT-OUT AND POSTAL ADDRESS VIOLATIONS**
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1 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,
2 servants, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or
3 participation with any of them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal
4 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation,
5 subsidiary, division, or other device, in connection with the advertising, marketing,
6 promotion, offering for sale, or sale of any product, service, or program, are hereby
7 restrained and enjoined from initiating the transmission of a commercial email that:
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10 A. Does not include a clear and conspicuous notice of the recipient's
11 opportunity to decline to receive further commercial electronic mail messages from
12 the sender at the recipient's electronic mail address and describes the means by
13 which the recipient can decline to receive future commercial email messages from
14 the sender;
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16

17 B. Does not include a functioning return electronic mail address or other
18 Internet-based mechanism, clearly and conspicuously displayed, that a recipient
19 can use to submit a reply electronic mail message or other form of Internet-based
20 communication requesting not to receive future commercial electronic mail
21 messages from the sender at the electronic mail address where the message was
22 received, and that remains capable of receiving such messages or communications
23 for no less than 30 days after the transmission of the original message;
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26 C. Does not include the sender's valid physical postal address; or
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1 D. Is sent to a recipient's email address, more than 10 days after the
2 sender receives a request from that email recipient not to receive future
3 commercial electronic mail messages from the sender at the recipient's electronic
4 mail address.
5

7 ASSET FREEZE

8 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,
9 servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or
10 participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal
11 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation,
12 subsidiary, division, or other device, except as provided herein, as stipulated by the
13 parties, or as directed by further order of the Court, are hereby restrained and
14 enjoined from:
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19 A. Transferring, liquidating, converting, encumbering, pledging, loaning,
20 selling, concealing, dissipating, disbursing, assigning, spending, withdrawing,
21 granting a lien or security interest or other interest in, or otherwise disposing of any
22 funds, real or personal property, accounts, contracts, shares of stock, lists of
23 consumer names, or other assets, or any interest therein, wherever located,
24 including outside the territorial United States, that are:
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1 1. Owned, controlled, or held by, in whole or in part, for the
2 benefit of, or subject to access by, or belonging to, any Defendant;

3 2. In the actual or constructive possession of any Defendant; or
4

5 3. In the actual or constructive possession of, or owned,
6 controlled, or held by, or subject to access by, or belonging to, any other
7 corporation, partnership, trust, or any other entity directly or indirectly owned,
8 managed, or controlled by, or under common control with, any Defendant,
9 including, but not limited to, any assets held by or for any Defendant in any
10 account at any bank or savings and loan institution, or with any credit card
11 processing agent, automated clearing house processor, network transaction
12 processor, bank debit processing agent, customer service agent, commercial mail
13 receiving agency, or mail holding or forwarding company, or any credit union,
14 retirement fund custodian, money market or mutual fund, storage company,
15 trustee, or with any broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading
16 company, precious metal dealer, or other financial institution or depository of any
17 kind, either within or outside the territorial United States;
18

19 B. Opening or causing to be opened any safe deposit boxes, commercial
20 mail boxes, or storage facilities titled in the name of any Defendant, or subject to
21 access by any Defendant or under any Defendant's control, without providing the
22

1 Commission prior notice and an opportunity to inspect the contents in order to
2 determine that they contain no assets covered by this Section;

3
4 C. Cashing any checks or depositing or processing any payments from
5 customers or clients of Defendants;

6 D. Incurring charges or cash advances on any credit card issued in the
7 name, singly or jointly, of any Defendant; or
8

9 E. Incurring liens or encumbrances on real property, personal property,
10 or other assets in the name, singly or jointly, of any Defendant or of any
11 corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or
12 controlled by any Defendant.
13

15 *Provided further*, that the assets affected by this Section shall include: (1) all
16 assets of Defendants as of the time this Order is entered; and (2) for assets obtained
17 after the time this Order is entered, those assets of Defendants that are derived,
18 directly or indirectly, from the Defendants' activities related to the marketing or
19 sale of any Covered Product, including the activities of any Receivership
20 Defendant.
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23 This Section does not prohibit transfers to the Permanent Receiver, as
24 specifically required in Section X.D (Delivery of Receivership Property), nor does
25 it prohibit the repatriation of foreign assets, as specifically required in Section XII
26 (Repatriation of Assets and Documents) of this Order.

DUTIES OF THIRD PARTIES HOLDING DEFENDANTS' ASSETS

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any financial institution, business entity, or person maintaining or having custody or control of any account or other asset of any Defendant, or any corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or controlled by, or under common control with any Defendant, which is served with a copy of this Order, or otherwise has actual or constructive knowledge of this Order, shall:

A. Hold and retain within its control and prohibit the withdrawal, removal, assignment, transfer, pledge, hypothecation, encumbrance, disbursement, dissipation, conversion, sale, liquidation, or other disposal of any of the assets, funds, documents, or other property held by, or under its control:

1. On behalf of, or for the benefit of, any Defendant or any other Person subject to Section V above;

2. In any account maintained in the name of, or for the benefit of, or subject to withdrawal by, any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above; and

3. That are subject to access or use by, or under the signatory power of, any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above;

1 B. Deny Defendants access to any safe deposit boxes or storage facilities
2 that are either:

3 1. Titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or
4 other Person subject to Section V above; or
5

6 2. Subject to access by any Defendant or other Person subject to
7 Section V above;
8

9 C. Within five (5) days of the date of service of this Order, provide
10 Plaintiff a sworn statement setting forth:

11 1. The identification number of each account or asset titled in the
12 name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or held on behalf of, or for the
13 benefit of, any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above, including all
14 trust accounts managed on behalf of any Defendant or subject to any Defendant's
15 control;
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18 2. The balance of each such account, or a description of the nature
19 and value of such asset;
20

21 3. The identification and location of any safe deposit box,
22 commercial mail box, or storage facility that is either titled in the name,
23 individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or is otherwise subject to access or
24 control by any Defendant or other Person subject to Section V above, whether in
25 whole or in part; and
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1 4. If the account, safe deposit box, storage facility, or other asset
2 has been closed or removed, the date closed or removed and the balance on said
3 date;

4
5 D. Within five (5) days of a request from any Plaintiff, provide Plaintiff
6 copies of all records or other documentation pertaining to each such account or
7 asset, including, but not limited to, originals or copies of account applications,
8 account statements, corporate resolutions, signature cards, checks, drafts, deposit
9 tickets, transfers to and from the accounts, all other debit and credit instruments or
10 slips, currency transaction reports, 1099 forms, and safe deposit box logs; and

11
12 E. This Section VI shall apply to existing accounts and assets, assets
13 deposited or accounts opened after the effective date of this Order, and any
14 accounts or assets maintained, held or controlled three years prior to the effective
15 date of this Order. This Section VI shall not prohibit transfers in accordance with
16 any other provision of this Order, any further order of the Court, or by written
17 agreement of the parties.

23 **MAINTAIN RECORDS AND REPORT NEW BUSINESS ACTIVITY**

24 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,
25 servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or
26 participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal
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1 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation,
2 subsidiary, division, or other device, are hereby restrained and enjoined from:

3 A. Failing to create and maintain books, records, accounts, bank
4 statements, current accountants' reports, general ledgers, general journals, cash
5 receipt ledgers, cash disbursement ledgers and source documents, documents
6 indicating title to real or personal property, and any other data which, in reasonable
7 detail, accurately, fairly and completely reflect the incomes, disbursements,
8 transactions, dispositions, and uses of the Defendants' assets;

9 B. Destroying, erasing, mutilating, concealing, altering, transferring, or
10 otherwise disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, any documents,
11 including electronically-stored materials, that relate in any way to the business
12 practices or business or personal finances of Defendants; to the business practices
13 or finances of entities directly or indirectly under the control of Defendants; or to
14 the business practices or finances of entities directly or indirectly under common
15 control with any other Defendant; and

16 C. Creating, operating, or exercising any control over any new business
17 entity, whether newly formed or previously inactive, including any partnership,
18 limited partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, or corporation, without first
19 providing Plaintiff with a written statement disclosing: (1) the name of the business
20 entity; (2) the address, telephone number, email address, and website address of the
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1 business entity; (3) the names of the business entity's officers, directors, principals,
2 managers, and employees; and (4) a detailed description of the business entity's
3 intended activities.
4

5 **VIII.**

6 **PROHIBITION ON DISCLOSING CUSTOMER INFORMATION**

7
8 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Defendants and their officers, agents,
9 servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or
10 participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal
11 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation,
12 subsidiary, division, or other device, are hereby restrained and enjoined from:
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14
15 A. Selling, renting, leasing, transferring, or otherwise disclosing the
16 name, address, birth date, telephone number, email address, Social Security
17 number, Social Insurance number, credit card number, bank account number, or
18 other financial or identifying personal information of any person from whom or
19 about whom any Defendant obtained such information in connection with activities
20 alleged in Plaintiff's Complaint; and
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23 B. Benefiting from or using the name, address, birth date, telephone
24 number, email address, Social Security number, Social Insurance number, credit
25 card number, bank account number, or other financial or identifying personal
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1 information of any person from whom or about whom any Defendant obtained
2 such information in connection with activities alleged in Plaintiff's Complaint.

3 *Provided, however,* that Defendants may disclose such financial or
4 identifying personal information to a law enforcement agency or as required by
5 any law, regulation, or court order.
6

8 **IX.**

9 **FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

10 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that, unless previously submitted in full
11 compliance with the TRO, each Defendant shall serve upon counsel for Plaintiff,
12 no later than five (5) business days after entry of this Order, a completed financial
13 statement accurate as of the date of entry of this Order, on the forms served on
14 Defendants with the TRO for Individual Defendants and for Corporate Defendants,
15 as the case may be, signed under penalty of perjury.
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19 The financial statements shall include assets held outside the territory of the
20 United States, shall be accurate as of the date of the entry of this Order, and shall
21 be verified under oath. Defendants shall attach to these completed financial
22 statements copies of all local, state, provincial, and federal income and property tax
23 returns, with attachments and schedules, as called for by the instructions to the
24 financial statements.

PERMANENT RECEIVER

A. APPOINTMENT OF PERMANENT RECEIVER

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Robb Evans and Associates, LLC is appointed Permanent Equity Receiver (“Receiver”) for Receivership Defendants and any of their affiliates, subsidiaries, divisions, or sales or customer service operations, wherever located, including, but not limited to, Apex Customer Care LLC, a California limited liability company, E-Level Marketing Inc., a California corporation, Future DNA LLC, a California limited liability company, Geneva Shox LLC, a California limited liability company, Genix Marketing LLC, a California limited liability company, Lead Kings LLC, a California limited liability company, Optim Products LLC, a California limited liability company, Penway LLC, a California limited liability company, Renvee LLC, a California limited liability company, and Vita Fuse LLC, a California limited liability company, with the full power of an equity receiver. The Receiver shall be the agent of this Court, and solely the agent of this Court, in acting as Receiver under this Order. The Receiver shall be accountable directly to this Court. The Receiver shall comply with all Local Rules of this Court governing receivers.

1 **B. RECEIVERSHIP DUTIES**

2 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Receiver is directed and authorized
3 to accomplish the following:
4

5 1. Assume full control of the Receivership Defendants by
6 removing, as the Receiver deems necessary or advisable, any director, officer,
7 employee, independent contractor, or agent of the Receivership Defendants,
8 including any Individual Defendant, from control of, management of, or
9 participation in, the affairs of the Receivership Defendants;
10

11 2. Take exclusive custody, control, and possession of all assets
12 and documents of, or in the possession, custody, or under the control of, the
13 Receivership Defendants, wherever situated. The Receiver shall have full power to
14 divert mail and to sue for, collect, receive, take in possession, hold, and manage all
15 assets and documents of the Receivership Defendants and other persons or entities
16 whose interests are now held by or under the direction, possession, custody, or
17 control of the Receivership Defendants. Provided, however, that the Receiver shall
18 not attempt to collect any amount from a consumer or to allow the Receivership
19 Defendants to continue to debit or otherwise charge a consumer's account, if the
20 Receiver believes the consumer was a victim of the unfair or deceptive acts or
21 practices alleged in the Complaint in this matter;
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1 3. Use any means necessary to take possession of and to secure all
2 areas of the business premises of the Receivership Defendants. Such steps may
3 include, but are not limited to, the following as the Receiver deems necessary or
4 include, but are not limited to, the following as the Receiver deems necessary or
5 advisable: (a) serving this Order; (b) completing a written inventory of all
6 receivership assets; (c) obtaining pertinent information from all employees and
7 other agents of the Receivership Defendants, including, but not limited to, the
8 name, home address, Social Security number, job description, method of
9 compensation, and all accrued and unpaid commissions and compensation of each
10 such employee or agent; (d) videotaping all portions of the locations; (e) securing
11 the locations by changing the locks and disconnecting any computer modems or
12 other means of access to the computer or other records maintained at the locations;
13 (f) requiring any persons present on the premises at the time this Order is served to
14 leave the premises, to provide the Receiver with proof of identification, or to
15 demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Receiver that such persons are not removing
16 from the premises documents or assets of the Receivership Defendants; and/or
17 (g) employ the assistance of law enforcement officers as the Receiver deems
18 necessary to implement the provisions of this Order;
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25 4. Conserve, hold, and manage all receivership assets, and
26 perform all acts necessary or advisable to preserve the value of those assets, in
27 order to prevent any irreparable loss, damage, or injury to consumers or to
28

1 creditors of the Receivership Defendants, including, but not limited to, obtaining
2 an accounting of the assets and preventing transfer, withdrawal, or misapplication
3 of assets, and including the authority to liquidate or close out any open securities or
4 commodity futures positions of the Receivership Defendants;
5

6 5. Enter into contracts and purchase insurance as advisable or
7 necessary;
8

9 6. Prevent the inequitable distribution of assets and determine,
10 adjust, and protect the interests of consumers and creditors who have transacted
11 business with the Receivership Defendants;
12

13 7. Manage and administer the business of the Receivership
14 Defendants until further order of this Court by performing all incidental acts that
15 the Receiver deems to be advisable or necessary, which includes retaining, hiring,
16 or dismissing any employees, independent contractors, or agents;
17

18 8. Choose, engage, and employ attorneys, accountants, appraisers,
19 and other independent contractors and technical specialists, as the Receiver deems
20 advisable or necessary in the performance of duties and responsibilities under the
21 authority granted by this Order;
22

23 9. Make payments and disbursements from the receivership estate
24 that are necessary or advisable for carrying out the directions of, or exercising the
25 authority granted by, this Order. The Receiver shall apply to the Court for prior
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1 approval of any payment of any debt or obligation incurred by the Receivership
2 Defendants prior to the date of entry of this Order, except payments that the
3 Receiver deems necessary or advisable to secure assets of the Receivership
4 Defendants, such as rental payments;
5

6 10. Determine and implement the manner in which the
7 Receivership Defendants will comply with, and prevent violations of, this Order
8 and all other applicable laws;
9

10 11. Institute, compromise, adjust, appear in, intervene in, or
11 become party to such actions or proceedings in state, federal or foreign courts that
12 the Receiver deems necessary and advisable to preserve or recover the assets of the
13 Receivership Defendants or that the Receiver deems necessary and advisable to
14 carry out the Receiver's mandate under this Order;
15
16

17 12. Defend, compromise, adjust, or otherwise dispose of any or all
18 actions or proceedings instituted in the past or in the future against the Receiver in
19 his or her role as Receiver, or against the Receivership Defendants that the
20 Receiver deems necessary and advisable to preserve the assets of the Receivership
21 Defendants or that the Receiver deems necessary and advisable to carry out the
22 Receiver's mandate under this Order;
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24

25 13. Continue and conduct the business of the Receivership
26 Defendants in such manner, to such extent, and for such duration as the Receiver
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1 may in good faith deem to be necessary or appropriate to operate the business
2 profitably and lawfully, if at all; provided, however, that the continuation and
3 conduct of the business shall be conditioned upon the Receiver's good faith
4 determination that the business can be lawfully operated at a profit using the assets
5 of the receivership estate;
6

7
8 14. Issue subpoenas to obtain documents and records pertaining to
9 the receivership, and conduct discovery in this action on behalf of the receivership
10 estate;
11

12 15. Open one or more bank accounts as designated depositories for
13 funds of the Receivership Defendants. The Receiver shall deposit all funds of the
14 Receivership Defendants in such a designated account and shall make all payments
15 and disbursements from the receivership estate from such an account;
16

17
18 16. Maintain accurate records of all receipts and expenditures that
19 he or she makes as Receiver;

20
21 17. Cooperate with reasonable requests for information or
22 assistance from any state or federal law enforcement agency; and

23 18. File reports with the Court on a timely and reasonable basis.
24

25 **C. COOPERATION WITH THE RECEIVER**

26 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that:
27
28

1 1. Defendants and their officers, agents, servants, employees, and
2 attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them,
3 who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether
4 acting directly or through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other
5 device, shall fully cooperate with and assist the Receiver. This cooperation and
6 assistance shall include, but not be limited to:
7

9 a. Providing any information to the Receiver that the
10 Receiver deems necessary to exercising the authority and discharging the
11 responsibilities of the Receiver under this Order;

17 service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation,
18 subsidiary, division, or other device, and the Receiver, shall allow Plaintiff's

A. Sending any statement, letter, facsimile, email or wire transmission, or telephoning or engaging in any other act, directly or indirectly, that results in a determination by a foreign trustee or other entity that a “duress” event has occurred under the terms of a foreign trust agreement, until such time that assets have been fully repatriated pursuant to the preceding Section of this Order; and




