

insofar as it challenges the peremptory strikes of Prospective Juror Nos. 5178 and 7098. (ECF Nos. 25, 34). The OSC explained that Petitioner appears to have exhausted this *Batson* claim only as to Prospective Juror No. 2544. Nonetheless, the SAP once again appears to raise a *Batson* claim regarding all three prospective jurors, without any attempt to surmount the exhaustion problem.

THEREFORE, within 30 days of the date of this Order, Petitioner is ordered to show cause why the SAP should not be dismissed since the Petition still appears mixed on its face with an unexhausted *Batson* claim as to two out of the three prospective jurors. Absent any reason to consider the Batson claim exhausted as to Prospective Juror Nos. 5178 and 7098, which Petitioner has failed to provide, Petitioner may discharge this second OSC by filing a Third Amended Petition containing only the three exhausted claims previously described in the Court's first OSC.

If within 30 days of the date of this Order, Petitioner does not file an amended petition with fully exhausted claims, or if he otherwise fails to provide a timely and satisfactory response to this Order, the Court will recommend immediate dismissal of the entire petition and this action. If Plaintiff intends to file an amended petition, it must be complete in itself without reference to the original petition, the FAP, or the SAP, and bear the designation "Third Amended Petition" along with the case number assigned to this action.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
