1 Plaintiff United States of America ("the government") and  
2 claimant Kaliffa Miller (the "Claimant") have entered into a  
3 stipulated request for the entry of this consent judgment of  
4 forfeiture resolving all interests the Claimant may have had in  
5 the defendant assetS, \$103,500.00 in U.S. currency And Three  
6 Money Orders Valued At \$2,500.00.

7 The civil forfeiture action captioned above was commenced  
8 on November 6, 2015. Notice was given and published according  
9 to law. Claimant Kaliffa Miller filed a claim on February 2,  
10 2016 (Dkt. No. 13) and an answer on January 28, 2016 (Dkt. No.  
11 11). No other claims or answers were filed and the time for  
12 filing claims and answers has expired.

13 The Court has been duly advised of and has considered the  
14 matter. Based upon the mutual consent of the parties hereto and  
15 good cause appearing therefor, the Court hereby **ORDERS, ADJUDGES**  
16 **AND DECREES** that \$93,500.00 of the defendant currency and the  
17 defendant money orders valued at \$2,500.00, plus all interest  
18 earned on the entirety of the defendant since seizure, is hereby  
19 forfeited to the United States, and no other right, title or  
20 interest shall exist therein. The remaining \$10,000.00 in U.S.  
21 currency of the defendant assets, without any interest, shall be  
22 returned to the Claimants as follows: The funds are to be made  
23 payable via ACH deposit to Claimant's attorney, David M. Dudley,  
24 Esq., Law Offices of David M. Dudley, 3415 South Sepulveda  
25 Boulevard, Suite 560, Los Angeles, California 90034. Mr. Dudley  
26 agrees that he will provide the information necessary to  
27 facilitate such payment according to law.

1 The Court finds that there was reasonable cause for the  
2 seizure of the defendant currency and the institution of this  
3 action. This consent judgment shall be construed as a  
4 certificate of reasonable cause pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2465.  
5 Each of the parties shall bear its own fees and costs in  
6 connection with the seizure, retention and return of the  
7 defendant currency.
