Plaintiffs Gemma, Neil, and Vickere Murphy (“Plaintiffs”) came before this Court and brought their action against Defendant Glendale Unified School District (“Defendant”) for violations of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (“IDEA”). Plaintiffs’ Motion for Summary Judgment was heard on February 27,


1 2017, which was granted in part on June 14, 2017, based on Defendant's violation
2 of procedural provisions of the IDEA, which prevented Gemma from receiving a
3 free appropriate public education ("FAPE"), as required by law. This Court
4 subsequently ordered supplemental briefing on the appropriate remedy for
5 Defendant's violation and conducted a hearing on the remedies issue on July 24,
6 2017.

7 The Court having received and considered the Motion papers and
8 supplemental briefing on remedy, in addition to any supporting documentation
9 filed therein, the evidence submitted by the parties, and the arguments presented by
10 the parties' respective counsel, this Court orders as follows:

11 **IT IS ORDERED** that Plaintiffs are AWARDED a judgment against
12 Defendant, requiring full tuition reimbursement in the amount of \$191,645.38,
13 consisting of \$175,934.00 in residential treatment services and related costs and
14 \$15,711.38 in travel, lodging, and transportation costs.

15 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Plaintiffs are AWARDED prevailing
16 party status and may bring a separately-noticed motion for attorneys' fees if the
17 parties cannot agree to a reasonable fee award.
