2 are principals in any crime so committed." § 31; see also § 971
3 ("[A]ll persons concerned in the commission of a crime, who by
4 the operation of other provisions of this code are principals
5 therein, shall hereafter be prosecuted, tried and punished as
6 principals and no other facts need be alleged in any accusatory
7 pleading against any such person than are required in an
8 accusatory pleading against a principal.") Petitioner's
9 objections are not well taken.

10 Having made a de novo determination of those portions of the
11 R. & R. to which Petitioner objected, the Court accepts the
12 findings and recommendations of the Magistrate Judge.

13 IT THEREFORE IS ORDERED that Judgment be entered denying the
14 Petition and dismissing this action with prejudice.
