ntiff was ordered to show cause, on or before January 24, 2018, why Christopher should not be 17 dismissed for lack of prosecution for failure to complete service of the summons and complaint 18 as required by Rule 4(m) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.¹ (See Dkt. 15, Court's Order 19 of January 17, 2018). Plaintiff was admonished that "[f]ailure to file a timely response to th[e] 20 Order to Show Cause may result in [Christopher] being dismissed for lack of prosecution and for 21 failure to comply with the orders of the court[.]" (Id.); see also Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b); Link v. 22 Wabash R.R. Co., 370 U.S. 626, 629-30, 82 S.Ct. 1386, 1388 (1962). As of the date of this Order, 23 plaintiff has not filed a response to the OSC. (See, generally, Dkt.). 24

Absent a showing of good cause, an action must be dismissed without prejudice if the

	4. Disjutiff shall file a number of some issues to defendent Anthony Obvistances as later.

Plaintiff shall file a proof of service relating to defendant Anthony Christopher no later
 than February 15, 2018.

Plaintiff is again admonished that failure to respond to the OSC or file a proof of service
 by the February 15, 2018, deadline will result in the action being dismissed without prejudice for
 lack of prosecution and/or failure to comply with the orders of the court. <u>See</u> Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b);
 Link, 370 U.S. at 629-30, 82 S.Ct. at 1388.

3. The Order to Show Cause Re: Dismissal Re: Lack of Prosecution, is hereby continued
pending compliance with paragraph one above.
