RE: Notice of Infringement of BlackBerry Patents; Confidential, Subject to F.R.E 408 and similar

Dear Ms. Hoge:

Since my letter dated 25 March 2016, BlackBerry has continued to review the WhatsApp Messenger program.

BlackBerry believes that the WhatsApp Messenger (at least Version 2.2.15 and other versions with the same functionality) infringe one or more claims of US Patent Nos. 7,372,961 & US 8,594,324. These are in addition to the patents identified in my previous letter.

Again, BlackBerry Corporation would like to discuss the matter with representatives of WhatsApp. No preparation is required on the part of WhatsApp representatives.

While this letter constitutes Notice of Infringement under 35 USC §287, BlackBerry wishes to engage in discussions with WhatsApp before any recourse to the Courts is taken. BlackBerry would like to (1) explain the basis for BlackBerry's belief that that WhatsApp products/services are infringing the foregoing patents and, (2) present a specific, written offer for a license (and where applicable under FRAND terms), under one or more of those patents including a royalty amount.
