ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE RE:
LACK OF PROSECUTION

Generally, a plaintiff must serve process on defendants within 90 days of the filing of the complaint. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. [4\(m\)](#). This matter was filed on February 18, 2023. Dkt. No. [1](#). More than 90 days have passed since the complaint in this case was filed, and Plaintiff has not filed a proof of service for any Defendant. Plaintiff is ordered to show cause, in writing, no later than May 26, 2023, why this action should not be dismissed for lack of prosecution.

The Court will consider as an appropriate response to this Order to Show Cause the filing of proof(s) of service showing that Defendants were served within the 90-day period or a showing of good cause to extend the service period. Failure to respond to the Order to Show Cause will be construed as consent to dismissal and will result in the dismissal of the action in its entirety without prejudice.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
