PALADIN, AND DOES 1 TO 10, 16 Defendants. 17 18 19 20 The Court will remand this unlawful detainer action to state court summarily 21 because it has been removed improperly. 22 On June 3, 2013, defendant Maria M. Paladin, lodged a Notice of Removal, 23 seeking removal of what appears to be a routine unlawful detainer action in California 24 state court, to this Court and also presented an application to proceed in forma 25 pauperis. The Court has denied the latter application under separate cover because 26 the action was not properly removed. To prevent the action from remaining in 27 jurisdictional limbo, the Court issues this Order to remand the action to state court. 28 Simply stated, plaintiff could not have brought this action in federal court in

the first place, in that Paladin does not competently allege facts supplying either diversity or federal-question jurisdiction, and therefore removal is improper. 28 U.S.C. §1441(a); see Exxon Mobil Corp v. Allapattah Svcs., Inc., 545 U.S. 546, 563, 125 S. Ct. 2611, 162 L. Ed. 2d 502 (2005). Even if complete diversity of citizenship exists, the amount in controversy does not exceed the diversity-jurisdiction threshold of \$75,000. See 28 U.S.C. §§ 1332, 1441(b). On the contrary, the unlawful-detainer complaint recites that the amount in controversy does not exceed \$10,000.

Nor does plaintiff's unlawful detainer action raise any federal legal question. See 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331, 1441(b).

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that (1) this matter be REMANDED to the Superior Court of Moreno Valley, Riverside County, 13800 Heacock Street, Moreno Valley, CA 92557, for lack of subject matter jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1447(c); (2) that the Clerk send a certified copy of this Order to the state court; and (3) that the Clerk serve copies of this Order on the parties.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
